#### IN MEMORIAM: CHARLES D. BARNETTE STORY BY RICHARD SILLS AND VINCE TALIANO PHOTOS BY JIM JORDAN AND DAN REED

Charles D. Barnette of Texarkana, TX passed away on June 6, 2011. Charles was one of the great people of our hobby, sharing his extensive knowledge of GM's Motorama cars, Eldorado Broughams and Presidential Limos unselfishly on the CLC Discussion Forum on a regular basis. He also wrote an annual report for **The Self-Starter** on the newest Cadillacs at the NAIAS (Detroit Auto Show), among other works. In 2002, he was awarded **The Self-Starter** Author of the Year award for his contributions.

When Charles was informed that both remaining Cadillac LeMans (#3 and #4 of only 4 ever built) would be at the *Cadillac Dream Cars* event at Capitol Cadillac in 2008, he tirelessly helped to promote the significance of the event. Not only did he attend, but other Motorama car enthusiasts from around the country attended as well including Jim Jordan of Oklahoma and David Temple of Texas.

Charles brought with him four silver chrome control knobs (tops) for the levers on the LeMans dash (two vents, temperature and defrost) that were accidentally left behind when LeMans #1 left Ohio for its "fatal home" of

California (LeMans #1 was later destroyed in a fire). Ironically, LeMans #3 was missing the same control knobs. Someone else may have viewed that as an opportunity to sell those parts for a handsome price, but Charles, motivated by the love of the hobby and of automotive history, donated them to the car. After returning home, Charles wrote the feature article on the event for our newsletter and website (<u>www.clcpotomacregion.org/2008fallcarshow.htm</u>), and for *The Self-Starter*. We have all sustained a serious loss by his passing.

These were among Cadillac's most popular models during the period when Cadillac became the undisputed sales leader in the luxury car market.



Like theme shows of the past, the goal of our *Dazzling DeVilles* show is to be one of the largest gatherings of DeVilles in recent Mid-Atlantic Area history. Every 1949-1970 DeVille owner is encouraged to attend this very special show. To celebrate the event, each registered owner will receive a commemorative dash plaque illustration of a DeVille that renowned artist Dan Reed is creating especially for this show. Also each registered owner will be given a commemorative show program highlighting the history of DeVilles and featuring a description of each DeVille pre-registered for the show. #### CARS ON THE PROMENADE STORY & PHOTOS BY SANDY KEMPER

Every June, as Father's Day approaches, my auto enthusiast friends ask me if I'm going to Sully for the car show. "No," I reply. And I explain that I'm going to another car show instead - one that is located on the oceanfront promenade of one of New Jersey's many beach towns, Sea Isle City. For the past twenty years, Sea Isle City has included a car show and parade on the Father's Day Sunday of its "Skimmer Weekend," a weekend of musical entertainment, children's activities, a large flea market and other activities. Through the generosity of some friends of mine who have a house in Sea Isle City, I get to spend a beach weekend "down the Jersey Shore" and I can enjoy a car show too!





In the past years, I was under the impression that there was some involvement in this show by the Jersey Cape Region of the AACA. But all of the publicity this year said that it was a joint production of the City and its Ambulance Corps. So, this year the show was open to cars through 1991 and it allowed modified automobiles. For the show, the cars were lined up in the morning on the promenade which is Sea Isle's boardwalk; however, the boardwalk structure (destroyed in the "Storm of '62") has been replaced with a bulkhead and a road-like surface. At 1:30PM, the cars were driven off the promenade behind a police car and ambulance escort with their sirens wailing and lights flashing in an antique auto parade through the town.

In contrast to previous years' shows, all of the 75+ cars this year were from 1950 and newer with an exception being a 1926 Model T. Also on display was a beautiful 1930's Auburn Speedster, but it was a modern replica.



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Although there were plenty of cars on the promenade from the 1960's - 70's, these years were not dominated by "muscle cars," surprisingly. And there were just a few new cars scattered among the classics too, courtesy of local dealers.

There were five (5) Cadillacs in the show, all of which were in very good condition: 1967 deVille convertible, 1970 deVille convertible, 1975 Eldorado convertible, 1978 Coupe deVille, and 1985 Eldorado Biarritz.

One of the more unusual cars was a 1976 Ford Pinto in superb condition. I cannot recall seeing a Pinto in a car show notwithstanding its popularity in the 1970's. Despite the controversies surrounding this vehicle during its production years, I'm glad that there are some good examples remaining to show us Detroit's 1970 response to the popularity of imported cars.

The Skimmer Festival Antique Auto Show is not as large as Sully in the number of cars on display, but looking at the cars with the sand dunes and the Atlantic Ocean in the background sure beats VA Route 28 for me.

By the way, what's a "skimmer," you may ask. It's a hat usually made of straw with a stiff brim also known as a "boater." It was a popular summer hat style in the late 19th century when Sea Isle City was founded.

Recently, my wife Sarah and I decided to venture north to the verdant hills of Hershey, Pennsylvania for yet another car event. Despite my innumerable trips to Chocolate Town, I must admit that I had never ventured up the rather impressive hill on the opposite side of the road from the Fall Hershey show until this past May. Richard Sills had joked for years that he'd been on the waiting list for a room at the Hotel Hershey during the AACA Fall Hershey meet forever. Finally he moved to Lancaster, thus eliminating the wait! So, although I'd heard of the Hotel Hershey through Richard, I'd never attempted to visit, let alone stay there. When Sarah and I went up to the AACA Museum in early May to take our 1959 Buick for the Indianapolis 500 Pace Car exhibition commemorating the 100th Anniversary of "the 500", we decided to take a few minutes to check out the Hotel Hershey. Imagine our surprise at discovering a magnificent National Historic Landmark hotel surrounded by gorgeous gardens, reflecting pools and manicured lawns.

I understand that the 300 tickets were quickly sold out, and the auction was reportedly a great success. Three very special organizations were the beneficiaries of the proceeds from "The Elegance" concours, dinner, and auction: The Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation, the AACA Museum, and the AACA Library & Research Center. Instead, Sarah and I dined at our "new" favorite Hershey area spot (now that Sasha's Hideaway has been converted to a sports bar) Pavone's Italian restaurant!





After dinner, while exploring the hotel, we ventured upstairs to a magnificent two-story area that featured a string quartet, abundant dessert stations and several bars. I remarked to Sarah that this was a very impressive treat for the hotel's guests, until I realized that the banquet attendees were just starting to come from the ballroom. At that point we ran into our friends Richard Sills & Shelley Chadick, along with our other CLC friends at the event, David & Toni Rothman. We enjoyed our visit, along with the music and general ambiance of the hotel before bidding our friends goodnight. Sunday morning Sarah and I were up early so that we could enjoy a sumptuous breakfast at the Hotel Hershey's "Circular Dining Room." This beautiful room conveniently overlooked the lawn where the classic automobiles were assembled for "The Elegance." I can't imagine a more scenic view to have while enjoying breakfast, lunch or dinner! Sixty-two 62 of the finest classic automobiles from around the United States and Canada were assembled by invitation only to attend this first annual Concours d'Elegance at Hershey. These automotive masterpieces were all perfectly arranged around the grand reflecting pool, manicured gardens, and elegant columned gazebos.



If the AACA Fall Easter Meet at Hershey is the Super Bowl of car shows, "The Elegance" is certainly striving to become the "Pebble Beach of the East." I have never seen a more magnificent and diverse collection of automobiles in one magical setting. The variety and unique nature of the classic cars displayed made the event all the more interesting. Most of the invited vehicles were "one of a kind" custom bodied classic cars from private collections. Even the most avid and well-connected car buff would never have the opportunity to view a collection of this magnitude in one location without travelling a great distance. To say that the majority of the cars were "unique" is truly an understatement. Custom bodied Cords, Rolls Royces, Cadillac V-16's, Packards, several 1950's concept cars, vintage racing Bugattis, Ferraris, Alfa Romeos, and many more graced the field for this event. The magnificent Cadillacs present included Charles Gillet's 1931 452A V-16 All Weather Phaeton, Bill & Barbara Parfet's 1930 Series 452 Fleetwood V-16 Roadster and their 1936 Series 90 Fleetwood V-16 Aerodynamic Coupe, and David & Linda Kane's 1937 Series 90 Fleetwood V-16 Coupe. I recognized a number of previous Concours d'Elegance winning cars from around the country at "The Elegance at Hershey." Many of these automotive masterworks have already graced the show fields at Pebble Beach, Amelia Island, Meadowbrook and some of the other prominent Concours d'Elegances in the past few years. Some of the cars present are also winners on the international concours circuit. Sarah noticed one winner from a concours in Switzerland and suggested attending that show would be nice. When she is interested in attending a car show, it must have something special to offer in addition to antique and classic cars! I replied that having our own concours classic would provide many opportunities to attend such events. That idea was not met with enthusiasm, but I keep trying!

Jack Rich, the owner of the fabulous Labourdette bodied Rolls Royce many of us enjoyed at last year's Fall Hershey, was the founder of "The Elegance at Hershey," along with a very esteemed board of directors which included Steve Moskowitz, the Executive Director of the AACA. I enjoyed speaking with Steve just before the event while at the AACA Museum. He remarked that although there were only sixty-two cars attending "The Elegance" this year, each one was a masterpiece of automotive art! He predicted, and I'm sure others will agree, that "The Elegance at Hershey" will become the East Coast's "Pebble Beach" in the coming years as it grows in size and stature. Interestingly, due to the small crowd and the select assortment of classic automobiles, the event had a very laid back, friendly, and intimate feeling. It was guite easy to photograph the cars and to ask questions of the owners or just to admire the classics. It was readily apparent that the owners of these magnificent vehicles were enjoying this Concours d'Elegance as much as we were. Thanks to the tremendous efforts by all of those involved, there is no doubt that "The Elegance at Hershey" was a complete success in its inaugural year. Sarah and I are looking forward to making this an annual event that "is not to be missed," and recommend it to all our car friends. It provides a rare opportunity to view "automotive artworks" at their finest in a setting that is simply exceptional, and at a location that is only 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ hours or so from the Washington area.





#### DON'T LET A MINOR INCONVENIENCE SPOIL THE ADVENTURE: STOCK YOUR CADILLAC OR LASALLE TO ENJOY THE SEASON STORY BY R. SCOT MINESINGER PHOTOS BY SANDY KEMPER AND TOM MCQUEEN

Every time you drive your collector Cadillac or LaSalle, you need to be prepared to deal with hiccups during the journey. Proper preparation of your collector automobile often can mean the difference between a pleasurable experience with a fun story or a painful or expensive inconvenience. Sometimes when I see some trunks opened at car shows they look original and clean, but not stocked to deal with the most minimal inconvenience. You can still carry all these items without junking up your trunk. Plus often one stock of tools and parts are good for a

multitude of cars and can be moved from car to car depending on which one you plan to drive. This article will deal with that important aspect of the hobby too.

Start by making sure that the spare tire in your car which is rarely used is properly inflated. In convertibles where the spare lays flat, consider mounting the white wall on the opposite side of the wheel rim. This way, when the tire is in the trunk (white sidewall up), the rim will hold many more tools and supplies. This is one way to keep your trunk neat while providing storage space. Make sure that your jack works by operating it while taking care to avoid bumper damage. Don't forget to make sure that you have the wheel cover key, (if your car is equipped with locking wheel covers) and keep a wheel chock. The tools I carry include, but may not be limited to, are: set of screw drivers, set of sockets (don't forget some years [mid 1980's] use both metric and English, set of wrenches, adjustable wrench, sand paper, pliers, feeler gauge, scissors, utility knife, spark plug gap, files, nut driver set, channel lock pliers, vice grips, jumper cables, flash light, ignition tester, allen wrenches, cold chisel, multi-meter, test light, ball peen hammer, rubber hammer (to put hub caps back on) and others. Cadillacs require large wrenches, like a 1" flare wrench for the fuel line at carb (you make one if they don't sell them), along with the other sizes, and wrench sizes up to 1-1/4" (ported vacuum switch). Use a flexible canvas type tool bag and this should fit in the well of the upside down spare tire. Keep your shop manual in the car always. It is a good idea to have a board (painted flat black so it looks good in the trunk) to use as a base when jacking up a car and a tarp too.





There is a minimum of parts and supplies that are always in my car even if when I'm traveling a short distance. At all times I carry a distributor cap, points, condenser (or rotor), coil, fuses, thermostat and gasket, spare belts, voltage regulator, alternator, starter, gasket material to cut, gasket material in a tube, thread sealant, bailing wire, fuel filter, engine oil, brake fluid, water, transmission fluid, duct tape, electrical tape, hand cleaner, Windex, Simple Green, speed shine, rags, newspaper, tire repair kit, fire extinguisher and first aid kit. These items don't take up very much space and can address many repairs that can be done quickly. You can store them in a nice box, a fitted suitcase, or some other elegant method.

It is a good idea to carry a few more tools and supplies for

longer trips such as a floor jack, a compressor (12V), a jump box, fuel pump and a water pump. These items consume more space and clutter up your trunk, so you have to take them out at a judged meet or car show.

Recently a club member suffered a breakdown in his car which is of a similar year to mine. Fortunately I had the materials in my trunk to execute a roadside, yet permanent repair. It really pays to have these materials in your trunk even if you don't enjoy turning a wrench. Chances are that someone you know can help you if the parts, tools and the vital shop manual are available.

Nicola Bulgari, an avid car collector and vice chairman of the Bulgari luxury goods firm, prefers not to dwell on the sheer number of automobiles in his car collection. "Is it important?" Bulgari asked. "Is it the number or the quality that matters? It's the quality." Bulgari buys each car for a reason, not just to expand his collection. So when he heard Cadillac was ending production of the DTS luxury sedan, Bulgari knew he wanted the last one off the line.

Introduced for the 2006 model year to replace the DeVille, the DTS is a significant automobile, primarily because of the Northstar V-8 engine under its hood, Bulgari said. The last DTS, built the week of May 23 at General Motors' Detroit-Hamtramck Assembly Plant, is now headed for Bulgari's collection. "I like the DTS, because it's a great sedan," Bulgari said. "It's the last of an era. I thought it would be wonderful to own the last Northstar in a DTS. It's one of the best engines ever designed — reliable and a performer."

For decades, the DTS and its predecessor, the DeVille, have anchored Cadillac's spot in the large luxury car market. Last year, the DTS outsold all other large luxury cars in the United States, topping the Mercedes-Benz S-Class, BMW 7-Series, Lexus LS430 and Lincoln Town Car. A version of the DTS also served as the U.S. president's limousine until 2009, when it was replaced by a new Cadillac presidential limousine. The last DTS will join an illustrious line of automobiles in Bulgari's collection, which he houses at facilities in Rome and Allentown, Pa. Bulgari said he looks forward to driving the DTS. He likes to drive his cars, not just put them away as museum pieces.





The grandson of a silversmith who opened a jewelry shop in Rome in 1884, Nicola Bulgari has helped the company grow into a global network of 293 stores selling high-end jewelry, watches, leather goods, perfumes and fashion accessories.

Bulgari developed his passion for automobiles, particularly American automobiles, as a child growing up in post-World War II Italy. He remembers seeing U.S. soldiers and dignitaries driving all makes and models of American automobiles through the streets of Rome. His collection includes every GM model made in 1941, the year he was born. "It's



something that goes back a long time," Bulgari said. "It started when I was 5 or 6 years old. It cultivated an incredible passion that has grown and gotten more sophisticated as I've come to understand the history better."

When he was 25, Bulgari bought his first Cadillac — a 1938 Cadillac V-16 town car. With its smooth, powerful engine, the Cadillac V-16 is considered one of the finest automobiles of all time. Bulgari sold his V-16, but said he would add another to his collection if he found the right one. "It was quite an experience to drive that car because the quality was second to none," Bulgari said. "The suspension design, the power, the engine... Everything was built with extraordinary quality."

Bulgari's collection includes plenty of other Cadillacs and LaSalles, a companion brand for Cadillac from 1927 to 1940. His collection of classic cars currently includes a 1932 Cadillac V-12 Fleetwood limousine; 1934 Cadillac Model 355B sedan; 1934 LaSalle coupe; 1940 LaSalle convertible coupe; 1940 Cadillac Series 62 convertible sedan; 1941 Series 61 sedanette; 1947 Model 7533 limousine; 1949 Model 7533 limousine; 1949 convertible (pictured above with Bulgari); 1954 Fleetwood sedan; and a 1970 Coupe deVille. The 1947 and 1949 limousines were used by the Vatican as part of the Pope's motorcade. In addition to the classic cars, Bulgari is a fan of contemporary Cadillacs. He owns a 2007 Cadillac BLS Sedan and 2009 Cadillac BLS Wagon, both part of a short-lived nameplate for the European market.

Bulgari also owns a 2009 XLR-V coupe equipped with a special Bulgari speedometer, a 2010 CTS wagon and 2009 CTS-V sedan. "I have news for you with a V," Bulgari said. "I want to see some Ferrari or Lamborghini on the road and I will give him a lesson. They'll never expect it."

He's also looking forward to future automobiles from Cadillac. Although the timing has not been determined, Cadillac plans to add a car larger than the CTS. Cadillac showed an XTS Platinum Concept car at the 2010 North American International Auto Show, providing an indication of the brand's direction. "I've seen the XTS Concept," Bulgari said. "I know it's superior. The DTS was a great sedan for its time, but it's a different world, a new period. It's time for something different."
