Following in the tradition of celebrating a theme at the Annual Fall Car Show at Capitol Cadillac, this year's theme will be *Dazzling DeVilles*. Specifically, DeVilles from the model years 1949-1970 will be the honored cars at the show to be held on Sunday October 30th in Greenbelt, MD. These were among Cadillac's most popular models during the period when Cadillac became the undisputed sales leader in the luxury car market.

Like theme shows of the past, the goal of our *Dazzling DeVilles* show is to be one of the largest gatherings of DeVilles in recent Mid-Atlantic Area history. Every 1949-1970 DeVille owner is encouraged to attend this very special show. To celebrate the event, each registered owner will receive a commemorative dash plaque illustration of a DeVille that renowned artist Dan Reed is creating especially for this show. Also, each registered owner will be given a commemorative show program highlighting the history of DeVilles and featuring a description of each DeVille pre-registered for the show. In addition, the DeVille owners will receive a framed certificate of appreciation for participating. It is time for the 1949-1970 DeVille owners to take their place alongside the V-12 / V-16, Eldorado, LaSalle, Fleetwood and Capitol Cadillac Alumni Car owners who have been featured at the Potomac Region's past theme-related car shows.

The judging will be done by the owners of the vehicles registered. The registered owners will be able to judge cars in all classes, including their own, and 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class, **including three special classes for the** *Dazzling DeVilles*.

Car Show Rules

- **<u>Rain or Shine</u>**: The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle(s) has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right from preventing any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: By registering a vehicle for the show, the registrant accepts the following terms: the Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class.

Many members of the CLC Potomac Region are members also of the Antique Automobile Club of America (AACA) and its many regions in the surrounding area (e.g. Bull Run, Chesapeake, and Sugarloaf Mountain, to name a few). So when we receive a request from a local AACA region to participate in a car show or to support one of its activities, we usually try to oblige.

Next month, on Sunday, September 11th, the AACA Sugarloaf Mountain Region (SMR) will hold its 42nd Anniversary "Activities Meet and Antique Car Show." This long-running show used to be held in Mt. Airy, Maryland. But this year the SMR has moved the location to Urbana Volunteer

Fire and Rescue Department grounds in Urbana, Maryland. This new site is simple to find and it's an easy drive. It's just off I-270 (Exit 26) on Urbana Pike (MD Route 355). Of important note for our club, the featured marque for this year's show will be Cadillac. This includes all Cadillacs through 1986. What an opportunity for us to show off the "*Standard of the World*!"

There will be participant judging (not points judging) and there will be special awards. There will be an auto parts flea market and a car corral, along with children's activities, door prizes, and a 50/50 raffle. Plenty of food will be available and participants will be entitled to a chicken dinner. The Urbana Fire Department grounds can hold over 150 show cars, most of which can be displayed on blacktop. But there are trees around the property that provide shade on sunny days. The Fire Department buildings will be open and there are indoor rest room facilities.

Since this show date falls on the tenth anniversary of the 9-11-2001 terrorist attacks on the United States, the SMR will honor the "First Responders - Fire, Rescue, E.M.S., Police and Military." They expect to have a special display of emergency, police and military vehicles. They have arranged for a special, limited edition dash plaque for the show participants. A memorial service is being planned with the Urbana Fire Department members. Besides the "9-11-2001" special display, there will be a "Winners Circle" exhibit featuring AACA National Award winners.

Recently we learned that the Mid-Maryland Corvair Society will be celebrating its 30th anniversary and hopes to have 30 Corvairs attend this show. We have been challenged to match or exceed this number with our Cadillacs. Mark your calendar and get your Cadillac ready to be the feature of the show!

The Cadillac Craftsman's League was a pretty cool thing. Formed in 1935, any Cadillac technician from Cadillac dealerships throughout the United States and Canada could participate. Membership entitled members to receive a monthly newsletter which had all kinds of new information, new service bulletins, tech tips and stories on the newest technologies and how they worked (pictured above is the February 1948 issue). In addition, members could participate in the awards program, which was a series of tests based on material that was contained in shop manuals, *Serviceman Bulletins*, service supplements and the round table charts provided by Cadillac. These tests would occur once a month or so and would be based on the current technical systems. The best place to get information on these tests was in the training materials that members received when they attended their normal GM training sessions.





The actual purpose of the Certified Craftsman's League was to help Cadillac servicemen carry out, and abide by, their responsibility to their customers, which is pledged in the Cadillac Craftsman's Code. This Code is the standard set by Cadillac Servicemen that has earned world acclaim through the years. Those principles are clearly defined by that Code. Below is the code:

> "I hereby pledge myself in all my work on Cadillac cars, to be thorough and exact, in diagnosing trouble; to recommend only that service which is to the best interest of the owner; to perform that work for which I am responsible in accordance with Cadillac standards to the best of my ability, and in all my dealings with Cadillac owners, to be courteous, honest, and ethical; and to do everything within my power to further the owner's satisfaction and promote his good will to Cadillac and to my dealer."

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There were originally 26 GM training centers in the U.S. The one covering the Northeast US was at the Tarrytown, NY training center. The GM training centers were dedicated buildings filled with cars, tools, classrooms and instructors that held regular one, two-day and longer training sessions for GM personnel in all divisions. Most of these centers were built in the '60s and '70s and were pretty active until most of them were shut down in the '90s in favor more of a more Internet-based learning style. Members would go there for a couple of days about once every two months and learn the latest technical information and receive training books that they could apply at their job repairing Cadillacs.

To qualify for the awards program for the Cadillac Craftsman's League, members had to have a certain amount of hours of GM training at the training centers and to take Cadillac service tests as they became available (about once a month). Members would enter their answers originally in a bubble sheet for each test and send this to GM in their return envelope. By the late '90s, members would enter answers into a telephone automated system. Oldsmobile had a similar program called the Oldsmobile Service Guild.






GM would also send Cadillac dealerships VCR tapes for training. Originally, they were huge laser discs called Disco-Vision, which looked like a CD but were the size of an LP record (pictured right). They would be played on a special player at the dealership. Then eventually DVDs came along toward the end of the program. The hour-long sessions would include sessions on topics such as "New Model Features". Members would also take tests during those sessions.

If members scored at the very highest level at the end of the year for all their tests, they would achieve Gold status. The level right below that was Silver, and below that was the Bronze level. The Bronze level still required a fairly decent score. When members achieved one of these distinctions, they could pick awards out of a catalog. In the early years of the program, awards included service lapel pins, wallets, wine glasses, crystal mugs, etc. Later in the program, Gold members could get color TVs, trips, large camping equipment, etc. The Silver level members would get things like toasters, small tents and camping equipment. Bronze members would get things like coffee mugs, T shirts, hats, towels and small radios.

To achieve the Gold Level, members typically had to painstakingly research the questions on the tests. Since they were open book tests, members could use whatever training materials they had. The test questions could usually be found somewhere in the printed material in the books. This took a great deal of time to research, but it was worth it. This way, members could appeal the test results if an answer was marked wrong by showing where the answer was in print somewhere. Gold level usually required a near perfect overall score.

The Cadillac Craftsman's League also held dinner award ceremonies. Only the best techs (Master Techs) from each dealership would be invited, maybe one or two techs, and the dealer principal. The entire event in a fancy locale was paid totally by Cadillac, but unfortunately the award ceremonies also went away when the program was eliminated in the '90s.
