
Although we are most interested in our Spring Show right now, please note that we have established the date of our Fall Show as Sunday, October 28th. Mark your calendars now!

Car Show Rules

- **Rain or Shine:** The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- **FREE Registration**: Anyone who registers a car and presents the dash plaque from the first show in May 1992 will receive free registration
- **Safety**: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class.

 Dealer's Choice Best Pre-War Best Post-War Best of Show Ladies Choice Long Distance (Driven Cars Only) A vehicle receiving "Best of Show" may also receive an award in its class, but will not be eligible to receive "Best Pre War" or "Best Post War" at the same show.

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Sandy thanked everyone for attending and welcomed CLC New England Region Director Chris Milici to the meeting. Chris was in town on business travel and made the effort to join us for our meeting. Also, we recognized our accomplished author (and winner of the CLC's 2008 Maurice Hendry Award) Chris Cummings who had another great article published in the April, 2012 issue of *The Self-Starter*.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Sandy reported that the Minutes from the March meeting were not read since they had been published and distributed to all members in the March, 2012 newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report covered the time period from the March meeting to date. The Region's income was \$195.80, mostly comprised of car show registrations. The total expenses for the same time period were \$479.03, a large portion of which was the dash plaques for the Spring car show.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Our current 2012 membership total is 204 members.

 discussed convertible tops and upholstery; performed demonstrations and answered



A First-Rate Trip to Seatco

On Saturday April 14th the Potomac Region scheduled a visit to Seatco, an upholstery shop specializing in interior (carpet, seat belts, dashes, upholstery) and convertible top work in Baileys Crossroads, VA since 1972. The purpose of the trip was to become more familiar with how interior work is performed to help restore members' Cadillacs and LaSalles. Neal, owner of Seatco and his staff, demonstrated some of the steps to manufacturer leather automotive upholstery components. They answered members' questions about various interior work and convertible top work they were considering on their Cadillacs. The trip was fun and very educational to say the least. As with most enjoyable events, it was too short.

The Seatco facility is large and all of the attendees were able to drive their Cadillacs inside the building, and there was





room for even more cars! The weather was beautiful, but we all drove our cars inside anyway.





There were seven cars, all convertibles – a mini car show. The club members and their Cadillacs that enjoyed the event were:

The event started with an introduction of the facility by Neal. That was followed by a demonstration of one of the many difficult steps in upholstering a Cadillac leather interior by Paul, a master craftsman who, by the way, installed the carpet in Sandy Kemper's Porsche almost 30 years ago. Then a gourmet lunch was served including shrimp, cheese, fruits, and fine wine. After that Neal answered questions about individual cars. It was one of the first events of the season, so there was a lot of visiting and catching up to do by members. At the end of the day, we left with an offer from Neal to return for future events/meetings. We hope to take him up on his generous offer.

The Big News on Climate Control Service

Seatco will begin servicing and repairing Cadillac climate control systems manufactured from 1964-76. I don't know too many club members that own a Cadillac made from 1964-76 with working climate control. Neal should be able to change all that. During the show I spoke with several of the members about climate control and the apparent imposing repair process. About five years ago no one would repair my 1970 Cadillac climate control, and so I spent a lot of time figuring out how to do it. It is not difficult. The most challenging aspect is the dash work on some of them. I thought Neal would be a natural to perform these repairs. Neal and I discussed the process and so he is ready to take on the work.

Climate control failures can be the result of one, two, three or more component failures. The way that they are repaired is that each component capable of causing the symptom is tested and replaced, if necessary, until the system works. For example, Jack McClow's 1975 Fleetwood Talisman's climate control required the following components to bring it to full function: re-built dash controller, re-built programmer (brain behind glove box), new fan, new fan relay, new expansion/POA refrigeration circuit device, new low fan relay (made from a regular fan relay), new vacuum hoses in engine bay, new vacuum hoses from engine bay to interior, new heater valve, new low pressure fuse and new wiring spade at programmer. The system was converted to R134 too. It works great now. The most difficult aspect of the repair was finding the bad spade on the programmer. The expensive original compressor, condenser, evaporator and heater core were all good. The duct and dampers with vacuum actuators were good too. I included this in the article because you can't really get an estimate before repairs commence. As always, select a trusted source for repairs.

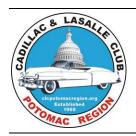

We had 56 beautiful Cadillacs and LaSalles at Capitol Cadillac on Sunday, May 17, 1992. The weather cooperated with the Potomac Region for its first dealer show in many years. The spacious facilities of Capitol Cadillac in Greenbelt, Maryland, provided the ideal setting. Although Capitol Cadillac is the oldest Cadillac dealer in the Washington, D.C. metropolitan area, the physical plant of the dealership is thoroughly modern and well-stocked with new and used cars, and large service and parts departments.

The owners of the showroom display era cars went to the extra effort of getting them to the dealership anywhere from a day before to a week before the show, in order to avoid last-minute confusion, and to permit Capitol's customers and staff to enjoy looking at the vintage beauties.





Capitol also offered to clear its service department for show cars in the event of rain, bun fortunately this was not necessary. The on-premises food facility was opened for the show guests and visitors, and provided good lunches and refreshments.

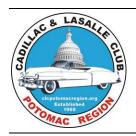
