



DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Sandy thanked everyone for attending. He noted that in the "President's Message" column in the May issue of *The Self-Starter*, Lars Kneller congratulates Vince Taliano for publishing the 100th issue of the *Caddie Chronicle*. Also, *Old Cars Weekly* announced the winners of its annual Golden Quill Award that recognizes club publications. Once again, the *Caddie Chronicle* was among the winners! Sandy announced that the Potomac Region extends its sympathy to the family of Raritan River Region member Pat Caruso, who passed away on Saturday, 19 May 2012 as a result of complications from a recent bone marrow transplant. Pat was a webmaster extraordinaire, creating and maintaining the websites of the Raritan River and Valley Forge Regions. He was awarded the CLC Web Site Excellence Award in 2003 and 2006. 

WINTER PARTS MEETS - FUELING OUR PASSION STORY & PHOTOS BY SANDY KEMPER

During the winter months, many of our classic Cadillacs rest in a state of automobile hibernation, away from the snow, ice and salt treatments on the roads that we travel. But these Cadillacs' owners are not resting. Rather we are in a state of readiness, awaiting the winter parts and swap meets that fuel our automobile passion when we are not driving our cars.



As the new year begins, one of the first parts meets within a reasonable distance from the greater Washington and Baltimore areas is the AACA Bay Country Region Parts Meet. This meet is held in late January, rain or snow or shine at the Governors Hall in Sailwinds Park in Cambridge, Maryland. There are both indoor and outdoor flea market spaces and a car corral. As one might expect, the weather influences both the number of vendors and attendees, even though there are indoor spaces in a heated building. Henry and Dan Ruby have attended this annual meet for many of its twenty-four years, although they reported that this year, there weren't any Cadillac parts that they could find.

If one travels in a different direction for parts needs and auto fervor, an organization called Auto Mania holds a swap meet and auto memorabilia show annually in January in the Agricultural Hall at the Allentown Fairgrounds in Allentown, Pennsylvania. Usually this event occurs on the weekend prior to the Cambridge meet. Although it is advertised as an allindoor show in "60,000 square feet of heated space," if the lots next to the building are clear of snow and the weather cooperates, there are vendors outside.

There is a dearth of parts meets in February. The local car collectors have to satisfy their interest by going to the auto auction in Atlantic City. But in March, the late winter parts market opens with two long running parts meets, one near Baltimore in Howard County and the other in Frederick, Maryland.

Someone had told me that the AACA Chesapeake Region's annual swap meet held at the Howard County Fairgrounds was "small." That was not the impression I got as I turned my car onto Fairgrounds Road on Saturday, March 10 and saw the substantial number of cars and trucks parked in the fields and the large volume of people walking to and from the flea market area. Indeed, when I started my exploration of the swap meet I realized that it was well-attended by both buyers and sellers alike and it was not very small at all.


Perhaps the mild weather throughout this winter inspired more people to participate this year than in previous years. But despite the clear, sunny skies, it was far from mild. Winter jackets and hats were necessary. Hot chocolate and coffee were the beverages of choice. It was windy and chilly, but there was plenty to see. There were no Cadillacs in the car





corral, although there was a fine 1966 Corvair Corsa that I thought was worthy of someone's purchase.







There were some Cadillac parts and one Cadillac banner flying over one vendor's space. But my fellow Cadillac club members reported that they didn't find any parts that they couldn't resist. However I heard that a set of "redneck champagne glasses" were purchased. Even with the cold wind, the meet fed my passion. And I found out later that this "small" meet, the Chesapeake Region's 39th Annual Antique Auto Parts Flea Market, was its largest meet ever with over 340 flea market spaces (and 800+ hot dogs sold).






Just two weeks later, the AACA Sugarloaf Mountain Region (SMR) held its 42nd Annual Indoor-Outdoor Antique Auto Swap Meet at the Frederick County Fairgrounds in Frederick, Maryland. Unlike its neighboring AACA region to the east, the SMR region holds its meet on two days, Friday and Saturday. What a difference in the weather. The SMR meet started on Friday in a cool and foggy air but by noon, it was shirt sleeves and sunscreen warm.

By comparison, more of the Frederick meet's flea market spaces were indoors than at Howard County. But the number of Frederick's outdoor sellers appeared to be less than in prior years. There were early crowds on Friday and by midafternoon the vendors with whom I spoke said that it had been a good meet so far. The car corral had two Cadillacs including a rough 1989 Cadillac limousine and a 1964 convertible that was a decent 20 footer. We don't know if either had sold by Saturday's meet close.

Now the car show and driving season is upon us. Our Cadillacs are out of their garages. And those swap meets that fueled our passion in the winter are fading into memory – until next January.

Our friends Jack & Cher Gallagher picked us up at LAX airport. We had arranged to have a tour of Jay Leno's Big Dog Garage and TV Show the following day. This was the excuse to come to LA for a long weekend of car shows, museums and cruise-ins. The next morning we walked over to the Peterson Museum specifically to see Bruce Myer's '32 Deuce Hot Rods – only in California where you can drive them all year long. Jack picked us up around 11:30 am with his sister Grace and his daughter Jen for our tour of the Big Dog Garage. At the Big Dog Garage, we were met by our tour guide, Bob, with a golf cart for six. He explained that Jay had 150 cars and 300 motorcycles in four hangers. I was getting eager. I have seen many car shows on television with Jay and his cars. Upon entering one of the hangers you are immediately drawn to the large paintings of old racing cars posters of the 1930's. It probably is easier to state the car manufacturers he doesn't own! All the cars are licensed and driven. After our hour and half tour we were on our way for the taping of the Jay Leno Show.





The next day we got up early to go to the Irvine Cruise-in at the former Ford Design Center. About 200 cars were there with the majority being exotics. Leaving Irvine we headed for Donuts Derelict's Cruise-in in Huntington Beach. We arrived at the tail end and the majority of the cars had left. The highlight of the day was yet to come - Huntington Beach Spring Show on the beach and in the town. Most of the cars in the beach parking lot were Woodies. The '49-51 Ford County-Squire had been manufactured in Long Beach. They outnumbered all the other cars in the lot.

The weather was warm and we had lunch at an outside café in the middle of all the cars on the street. Former neighbors and car enthusiasts, Bob & Kathy Jones, now California residents, joined us. 
POTOMAC REGION CELEBRATES ITS 20TH ANNIVERSARY SPRING SHOW
AT CAPITOL CADILLAC

Despite a mostly overcast day, the show field was at near capacity!

Sunday May 6, 2012 began as a cloudy day with light mist in the air, but became partly sunny by mid-afternoon. As a result, the turnout was decent with 61 cars on display for the Potomac Region's 20th Anniversary Spring Show at Capitol Cadillac in Greenbelt, MD.
