Our condolences go out to James Hartnett on the recent passing of his wife, Eileen.



Barrel Oak Winery is also a relatively new winery with an excellent product, and it features spectacular views from the large patio. Incidentally, this winery employs a geothermal heating and cooling system that I designed years ago. Barrel Oak Winery was the favorite last year, and I think everyone wished we could have stayed longer. This winery was featured on the front page of *The Washington Post* Metro section almost a year ago as a place where everyone was having a lot of fun. Barrel Oak is expecting us and will provide a roped off parking area.

The Paradise Spring Winery and Barrel Oak both sell delicious food if a picnic is not your choice. At each winery there are tours, tasting, and hanging out with friends enjoying a glass of wine on the terraces. Use Map-quest or other software to obtain the directions that you need to join us at the winery of your choice. Note this event is dependent upon the weather. 

Car Show Rules

- Rain or Shine: The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- <u>Judging / Parking Rules</u>: The Potomac Region reserves the right (1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and (2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. **There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage.** Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class.

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Chuck thanked everyone for attending. He mentioned that Vince Taliano has proposed the idea of moving the monthly meetings to Sunday afternoons starting in 2013 to reduce work conflicts and rush hour commutes as much as possible. 

100-YEAR-OLD DRIVER HITS 11 NEAR LOS ANGELES SCHOOL BY SHAYA TAYEFE MOHAJER ASSOCIATED PRESS AUGUST 29, 2012

LOS ANGELES - The screams of women and children didn't cause a 100-year-old driver to stop as he backed his large, powder blue Cadillac onto a sidewalk across from an elementary school and hit 11 people, including nine children. So people began pounding on his windows screaming for him to stop, a witness said. Alma Solache said she was buying her children an afterschool snack Wednesday just before the accident outside a South Los Angeles school. "He was not paying attention," said Solache, 24, adding that it was at least two or three seconds before the vehicle halted and people began pulling children out from beneath the car. Four of the

children were in critical condition when firefighters arrived but they were stabilized and were in serious condition at a hospital, city fire Capt. Jaime Moore said. Everyone was expected to survive, he said. Children's backpacks, shoes, candy and loose change were strewn about the scene behind a discount grocery store across from Main Street Elementary.

Police said the driver, Preston Carter, was being very cooperative and drugs or alcohol were not a factor in the crash. Carter talked to television reporters after the crash some five miles southwest of downtown Los Angeles. He said he has a driver's license and will be 101 years old Sept. 5. "My brakes failed. It was out of control," Carter told KCAL-TV. Asked about hitting the children, Preston said: "You know I'm sorry about that. I wouldn't do that for nothing on earth. My sympathies for them." Carter was pulling out of the grocery store parking lot, but instead of backing into the street, he backed onto the sidewalk, police Capt. George Rodriguez said. "I think it was a miscalculation on his part. The gentleman is elderly," Rodriguez said. "Obviously he is going to have some impairment on his decision making." Rodriguez said the collision was being investigated as an accident, and Carter was not under arrest. He has a valid driver's license, Rodriguez said.

On Saturday July 7, 2012, the Central Pennsylvania Region and the Upper Susquehanna Region held their Sixth Annual CLC Inter-Regional Meet at the AACA Museum, Hershey, PA. Awards were presented to the best Cadillacs and LaSalles on a decade-by-decade basis, as determined by peer judging. In addition, this show welcomed other makes of cars to provide additional variety. They were given awards in two age-related categories, pre-1970 cars and 1970 and newer cars.

This show provides participants with the unique opportunity to view the ever-changing displays within the AACA Museum. This summer, the Museum is featuring a display honoring 100 Years of Chevrolet, with many rare cars on exhibit including a prototype from the GM Heritage Center.

The exhibit also includes an example of the first Chevrolet Suburban, a 1935 model. (When the origins of the Suburban are discussed, it is

rarely mentioned that Cadillac had one first -- in the early 1920's. An example from 1921 was displayed at this year's Grand National Meet in St. Augustine.) Another interesting Chevrolet in the exhibit is a 1918 V-8 touring car that has been owned by one family since new. (Chevrolet offered V-8s in 1917 and 1918, a little-known fact for a car-trivia contest.)

Following the meet, participants were welcomed to the nearby home of Art & Jan Archambeault (Art is Assistant Director of the Central Penn Region) for cocktails and refreshments by the pool. Afterwards, the group enjoyed dinner at a nearby restaurant, where they continued to socialize and talk about Cadillacs. The CLC Inter-Regional Meet at the AACA Museum attracts out-of-town participants on a regular basis, because of the appeal of the Museum and the hospitality of the host Regions.
