

IN MEMORIAM: BARTON MITCHELL BY THE MITCHELL FAMILY AND VINCE TALIANO



Potomac Region member Barton Stewart Mitchell, 73, of Lutherville, Maryland and Marco Island, Florida, passed away on Sunday, October 6, 2013 at his residence in Lutherville from complications related to his struggle with lung cancer. His final days were filled with family and close friends, just as he had wanted.

Barton, a long-time CLC member, was the owner of an award-winning 1953 Eldorado and a 1954 Series 75 Limousine that he purchased in 1970 (the first car in his collection). In 2005, he and his wife Beth opened their spacious grounds and to-die-for garage setup to us as the final stop of our Fall Driving Tour after Region members visited Al Prueitt and Sons Restoration Services in Glen Rock, Pennsylvania. Each of the cars that was on display either inside the garage or outside on the ample tarmac had a placard in front of it with information on the vehicle.



Barton was born in Baltimore, Maryland on April 4, 1940, the only son of E. Stewart Mitchell and Irene Barton Mitchell. He attended McDonogh School, Class of 1958, and then Washington & Lee University where he graduated in 1962 with a Bachelor of Science with Special Attainment in Commerce and was a member of Phi Kappa Psi fraternity. Barton was married to his wife. Elizabeth Snow Mitchell, for nearly 38 years. Barton is survived by Beth, their children and grandchildren.










I remember how proud he was when he accepted Best of Show from Daniel Jobe for his '53 Eldorado at our *Eldorado*




UPDATE ON THE CLC POTOMAC REGION MATCHING FUNDS DRIVE FOR CLCMRC

Recently, the Potomac Region announced that it will match 100% of any Region member's contribution to the Cadillac LaSalle Club Museum and Research Center (CLCMRC) Building Campaign until a grand total of \$2,500 is matched. To track the contributions, we asked Region members to U.S. mail checks made out to the CLCMRC to Potomac Region Treasurer Harry Scott, who will then U.S. mail them to the CLCMRC along with the Region's contributions. That ensures that members receive the tax deduction, and we can track our progress.


Thru October 10th, Lynn Gardner, Maurice Jones, Craig Perrotty, Vince Taliano, Baxter Saucier, Richard Sills, Jack McClow, Bob Norrid and Bryce Frey have donated a total of \$1,155 (thanks, guys). However, that is still less than 50% of our



overall goal of \$2,500 in contributions by our members. We challenge each Potomac Region member to donate a minimum of \$50 to this worthy cause.

For the rest of our members, let's follow the example of the aforementioned members and contribute to the CLCMRC Building Campaign.







On September 29th, the ground-breaking ceremony was held. Site work will begin and the contract will soon be signed. The foundation and floor will be constructed during October. The structural steel is scheduled for delivery in eight weeks. Work will continue through the winter and all work will be scheduled for completion by June 30th.

SEPTEMBER 16, 2013 MEETING MINUTES BY SANDY KEMPER

PLACE: Capitol Cadillac, Greenbelt, MD

TIME: 7:30 PM

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Sandy thanked everyone for attending and thanked Daniel Jobe for hosting the meeting at his dealership. Sandy reported that the Potomac Region has been invited to participate in MPT's MotorWeek Carnival on Saturday September 28th from 11-4 at Lilypons Water Gardens in Adamstown, MD. The Region will be manning a booth where we will be promoting our club, promoting our fall car show and sell club and Cadillac-related merchandise. An announcement has been sent to members on the email distribution list. Also, the CLC has released its full list of winners from the Grand National in Quincy, MA. The list of Potomac Region members who won awards has been added to the *In the News* section of our Region's website.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Minutes from the July meeting were not read since they will be published and distributed to all members in the August, 2013 newsletter. We did not hold a meeting in August. Instead we participated in the *Back to the Fifties* car club's weekly cruisein.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report covered the time period from the July meeting to date. The Region's income was \$ 146.94. The total expenses for the same time period were \$671.19. Contributions to our CLCMRC Building Campaign Matching Funds program now total \$2,110 (\$1,055 from members and \$1,055 matching from the region). Thanks to the members who answered the challenge and donated a minimum of \$50 to this matching funds campaign. Some members are waiting to hear from CLCMRC board member Bill Anderson that the contract with the building's construction company has been signed before making their contributions. Jack McClow pointed out that there are two CLCMRC funds: an operating expenses fund and the building fund. Contributions made under our Region's campaign are directed toward the building fund. However a contribution made to the CLCMRC as part of a member's CLC membership renewal (printed on the dues form) is directed to the operating fund and cannot be included in our Region's campaign.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Our current 2013 membership total is 199 members. We recently received a compliance report from the National CLC Office that showed that 96% of our members are currently active nationally. The seven (7) Potomac Region members who are inactive nationally have been contacted and will have to renew nationally in order to continue their membership with the Potomac Region. In October, the 2014 membership renewal forms will be U.S. mailed to members.





MEMBERSHIP REPORT, cont'd: In response to a question about Life Memberships, both Richard and Jack advised the members that the CLC annual dues will increase beginning January 1, 2014. If members are considering paying their annual dues forward or obtaining a Life Membership, they may consider making the payment by the end of the year.

ACTIVITIES REPORT: The following activities were discussed:

1. Recent Events:

- Vern Parker's 25th Annual (and Last) Invitation Antique Car Show, Spring Hill Recreation Center, McLean, VA, Sep 1. Quite a few members attended Vern's last show. Coverage appeared in the September issue of the newsletter.
- Miss America Pageant Parade, Atlantic City, NJ, Sep 14. Randy and Ryan Denchfield and Chuck Piel drove their cars in the parade carrying contestants in this pageant. A story will appear in the October issue of the newsletter.
- CLC Raritan River Region 4th Annual Dealer Show at Gold Coast Cadillac, Oakhurst, NJ, Sun, Sep 15. Chuck and Dave Piel and Jack McClow and Bob Norrid attended this show. Chuck and Dave drove to the show in Chuck's 1968 convertible after participating in the Miss America Pageant Parade.

2. Upcoming PR Events:

- Fall Driving Tour, Northern Virginia Wineries, Sun, Sep 22nd. This year's Fall
 Driving Tour will include stops at two of Northern Virginia's finest wineries. The tour will
 begin at the Paradise Spring Winery in Clifton, VA where members will meet at 12:00
 noon. Members who plan to participate are asked to RSVP to Scot Minesinger at
 rscotm@cox.net or 703-283-2021 so he can contact attendees in case we have to reschedule.
- City of Rockville Antique and Classic Car Show, Rockville Civic Center, Rockville, MD, Sat, Oct 19. Our club is one of the sponsoring car clubs and everyone's participation is encouraged. Let's try to get more Cadillacs than Packards on the show field.
- Annual Fall Car Show, Capitol Cadillac, Greenbelt, MD, Sun, Oct 27th. In honor of the late Henry Ruby and the 60th anniversary of the 1953 Eldorado, the theme for this year's Annual Fall Car Show will be *Colossal Convertibles*, celebrating the long and storied history of Cadillac and LaSalle open cars. If feasible, Henry's 1958 Eldorado Biarritz will be on display, as well as three cars from the Scott Milestone collection: the factory-built "super-charged" 1953 Eldorado, one of the only two 1953 Cadillac LeMans concept cars remaining and a 1953 Cadillac custom convertible. To date, over 25 pre-registrations have been received. Promotional material has been placed on the CLC Discussion Forum and emails sent to local organizations such as Goss' Garage and MotorWeek. Dan Ruby displayed the Henry Ruby trophy that Dan will award to the car that he believes his father would select as his favorite, similar to the Dealer's Choice Award. Dan will make the presentation after all of the other awards have been distributed.

 - 56th Annual Antique Auto Assembly, Armed Forces Retirement Home, Washington, DC, Sun, Oct 6. Cancelled due to federal government shut down.
 - AACA National Eastern Fall Meet, Giant Center & Show Grounds, Hershey, PA, Wed-Sat, Oct 9-12.

 GN will be the closest distance to our region for several years to come. Don't delay. Make
 your hotel reservations soon.
- Randy Denchfield proposed that the Region consider making a contribution in the name of
 the club to benefit a local charity. This could be in the form of a car show in which proceeds
 would be designated to the charity or simply a publicized donation from the Region's funds.
 Sandy said that this idea would be brought before the Region's officers.

GENERAL DISCUSSION:

- Daniel Jobe answered questions about Cadillac's forthcoming cars and its participation in various automotive events.
- Chris Cummings announced that his new book, Cadillac V-16s Lost and Found, is in production and should be published by the end of the year. He distributed a flyer about the book.
- Also, Chris displayed the 2013 CLC The Self-Starter V-16 Author of the Year Award that he received at the CLC Grand National in August.
- Dan Ruby mentioned that he had provided some assistance to an event held in Washington,
 DC by the Cadillac Allanté Club.

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

Car Show Rules

- Rain or Shine: The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- Safety: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right (1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and (2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class.
- Lunch Ticket: Each registered car owner will receive one free lunch ticket. The lunch ticket will entitle the person to receive the following from Red, Hot & Blue BBQ, who will be on-site serving food:
 - 1) One Beef, Chicken or Pork Sandwich
 - 2) One Side order of Beans or Potato Salad and Cole Slaw
 - 3) One Drink including bottle water

Anyone without a lunch ticket will pay Red, Hot & Blue cash directly at the time of their purchase.

The 7th Annual St. Michaels Concours d'Elegance was held in Cambridge, Maryland, the weekend of September 27, 28, and 29th, at the Hyatt Regency Chesapeake Bay Golf Resort. It was the first time it was held at the Hyatt Regency, a new venue providing one of the most beautiful settings of any Concours d'Elegance in the country. This year's event featured 47 cars dispersed across three classes:

- rare grand classic American and European automobiles from 1900–50
- American and European sports and racing automobiles from 1948–63
- wood bodied automobiles through 1953, the last year for wood bodied production cars

In addition, seven vintage wooden speedboats were also on display. The event benefited the Mid-Shore Community Foundation, founded in 1992, benefitting the five-county, Mid-Shore region.

The final announcement made was that Charles had just celebrated his 90th birthday!!







Shortly after, his sons joined the operation, and have been there ever since. Over thirty years later, the company enjoys a reputation for fine work, integrity, and dependability, with over 100 national awards from such clubs as the AACA, CCCA, and the RROC.









Our special tour on Saturday, in which approximately 40 vehicles participated, was to the bayside estate of Mr. and Mrs. John "Chip" E. Akridge, III, of Oxford, Maryland. (Mr. Akridge is Chairman of the John Akridge Company, a large Washington D.C. based real estate holding company, which he founded in 1974.) This 1930's estate has been beautifully restored and expanded, with amazing gardens, and a half-mile long tree lined drive leading up to the main house. 
Cadillacs were well represented in the parade. Potomac Region member Rob

They witnessed first-hand Bert Parks' singing "There she is......" for many years. So it was not only to have fun with our car, but also in memory and tribute to "Granny and Pop", that I wanted to participate.

Robison had the oldest car in the parade, his gorgeous Belden Blue '47 Convertible Coupe. We were assigned to Miss Missouri, Shelby Ringdahl. Shelby's "handler", who would also ride in the car during the parade, was her father, Bruce.





Randy and Ryan Denchfield drove Miss New Mexico and Miss New York (the eventual Miss America) in their '72 Olds and '76 Firethorn Eldorado convertibles, respectively. Cliff Woodbury, of the Valley Forge Region, was directly in front of me in his '67 GTO convertible. There was also a '58 convertible, two '64 Eldorados, and another '76 Eldorado in the parade.

The parade started at about 5:15 PM at the northern end of the boardwalk and ran the entire 2.3 mile length of the boards in Atlantic City. With numerous marching bands, including that of our local Mt. Hebron High School, and the Philadelphia Eagles cheerleaders (right in front of Cliff Woodbury), the parade took over 2 ½ hours. During that time, I never touched the gas pedal. Along the route were over 200K very enthusiastic spectators, clamoring for each contestant to "show me your shoes", the theme of



Around each car were two flag bearers, with the flag of the state for each contestant, a policeman and a member of the military on foot. Security was tight, as the police were concerned about a repeat of the Boston Marathon bombing. We were checked twice by bomb sniffing dogs that were taken around the car.

There was a live TV feed from the Philadelphia ABC affiliate, who broadcast the entire parade. Clips from that broadcast were shown on Sunday night during the national ABC broadcast of the final pageant competition and crowning of Miss New York, Nina Davuluri, as Miss America.

The parade ended on the south end at Albany Avenue. From there, each contestant would be ferried back up to Boardwalk Hall (the old convention center), for a formal photo in the car and disembarkment back to the hotel. As we entered the street, a motorcycle policemen came up to me and said; "Follow me – don't stop for anything or anybody."





What ensued was a 65 MPH run through downtown Atlantic City (going through red lights and down the wrong side of the street) with three motorcycles leading the way – much the way I would envision the Secret Service would drive the President. Bruce Ringdahl, Shelby's dad, said it was the most fun thing he'd done the entire week of the pageant. It certainly was the most exhilarating drive I've had in "Big Blue" (or any car for that matter!). Randy and Ryan, as well as the other drivers, had the same escort with their contestants.

Dave and I hooked back up at Boardwalk Hall, and we high-tailed it out of Atlantic City, which was a real mob scene. We drove up to Seaside Heights that night with the heater on and the top down on our way to meet Jack McClow and Bob Norrid at the CLC Raritan River Region's meet at Gold Coast Cadillac in Oakhurst, New Jersey, held the next day (pictures below from the show). Of course, we were rooting for Shelby, who finished in the top five of popular fan voting. She made the final 12, and represented herself extremely well.

We had a great time and hope to be able to participate in the 2014 parade.


