So, can you imagine working construction all day in it and actually making progress? Yikes!

Obviously things are continuing to move at a pace that makes my photos from January 19th already outdated. The weather challenges could not have been predicted, and yet everyone is clearly soldiering-on without complaint or excuses. These photos give evidence of the dedication on the site.

OPINION SURVEY RESULTS POTOMAC REGION'S DONATIONS TO CHARITIES & OTHER CAUSES

Late last year, we drafted a simple survey asking the Region membership to express their opinions about the idea of the Region making a donation in the name of our club to benefit a local charity. The survey was published in both the November and December newsletters. About 6% of our membership responded. The survey results are below.

1. Do you favor the idea of the Potomac Region donating funds to a charitable organization?

Almost unanimously the response was "Yes."

2. If you favor the idea of donating funds, to what type of organization should the Region donate funds? (e.g. humanitarian: e.g. children, veterans, homeless, disease (heart, lung, cancer, etc.); animals, auto-related, etc.?

20% of the respondents said "veterans." Another 20% of the respondents said "children." Over half said "auto-related, AACA or CLC." Of these "auto, AACA, CLC" responses, there were a few additional comments of note. One suggested that we provide funds for someone in the club who may be in need or consider a giving to a college student. Another auto-related comment suggested that we give to an organization that provides specially equipped vans for disabled people or wounded veterans.

3. Do you favor donating funds from our treasury or holding an event (e.g. a car show or other event) from which the proceeds would be donated to the charity? The replies to this question may be best summarized by percentages, rather than commentary.

4. If you favor holding an event, what type of event do you have in mind?

Since there were only a few "hold an event" responses to the previous question, correspondingly there were mostly "not applicable" replies. Those that did respond suggested a car show and one said "raffles, silent and live auctions."

5. Would you be willing to chair and organize such an event?

Only one respondent said "Yes." Almost all of the others replied "No." But several of the "No" respondents stated that they would be willing to help at an event.

Thanks to all of the members who took the time to participate in this survey. The Region's officers will discuss the idea of charitable contributions at an upcoming meeting.

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Sandy thanked everyone for attending. He noted that Snyder's was offering a "Cadillac Margarita" on their menu - probably just a coincidence. He announced that 2014 is the Region's 45th year. Later this year, the Region will hold a 45th Anniversary Party. Sandy recognized Franklin Gage for his being honored at the AACA National Awards Banquet in Philadelphia on February 8. Franklin received the Drivers Participation Award, Pre-War. Lastly, Sandy mentioned that PR member and author Chris Cummings' new book, *Cadillac V-16s Lost and Found: Tracing the Histories of the 1930s Classics*, is now available for purchase.

 - Spring Driving Tour to Mid Atlantic Antique & Collector Car Center, Kennett Square, PA, Sat, Apr 13. Activities Director Scot Minesinger is planning to hold a driving tour to the MACCC in April to coincide with the AACA's Brandywine Region's Annual Flea Market at the car center. More details soon.
 - Annual Spring Car Show & Automobilia Auction, Capitol Cadillac, Greenbelt, MD, Sun, May 4. The show flyer will be published in the March newsletter.
- 3. Other Upcoming Events: The following events were mentioned:
 - Old Car & Train Day, Home of Clem Clement, Fairfax, VA, Sun, Feb 23. An event featuring antique cars and model trains together.
 - 41st Annual Atlantic City Classic Car Show & Auction, Atlantic City Convention Center, Atlantic City, NJ, Fri-Sun, Feb 28-Mar 2. Most of the cars are street rods & customs, but there are original & antique cars in the show also. Show cars are by invitation only. The show is all indoors.
 - Amelia Island Concours d'Elegance, Amelia Island, FL, Fri-Sun, Mar 6-9. Probably the East Coast's premier concours event.
 - 41st Annual AACA Chesapeake Region Parts Meet, Howard Co Fairgrounds, West Friendship, MD, Sat, Mar 8. A popular parts meet staffed by some and attended by many PR members.
 - 44th Annual AACA Sugarloaf Mountain Region Parts Meet, Carroll County Agriculture Center, Westminster MD, Fri-Sat, Mar 28-29. This is the second year at this location for this meet which is popular with our members.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Sandy provided a summary of the responses to the opinion survey: "*POTOMAC REGION'S DONATIONS TO CHARITIES & OTHER CAUSES,*" that had been issued in both the November and December newsletters. The summary will be published in an upcoming newsletter.
- 2. Sandy reported on behalf of the Region's National representative Jack McClow that construction on the CLC Museum is continuing despite the terrible winter weather. Photos of the work with deep snow on the ground will be published in the next newsletter. A grand opening will be held at the conclusion of this year's CLC National Driving Tour in September.





NEW BUSINESS: Carol Yarnell provided a summary of two bills proposed before the Maryland legislature that have an impact upon collector car owners. SB629 permits local jurisdictions to impose a surcharge of \$20 per vehicle registration. HB1290 affects Maryland's "Historic Vehicle" registration. It resurrects a bill that was "killed" in committee two years ago after an extraordinary outpouring of opposition by collector car enthusiasts. HB 1290 (Sponsor Delegate Herb McMillan, R-Anne Arundel County) would change Historic Vehicle Registration eligibility to require the vehicle be:

- 25 years or older (the current requirement is 20 years),
- B) Insured with a specialty collector's insurance policy, and
- C) Have another vehicle registered without Historic plates for regular use owned by the applicant.

The alleged reason to tamper with our Historic law has been to curb "Abuse". Vehicles are registered Historic to reduce fees and avoid emissions testing, and then driven daily. The abuse is trivial since only about 2 1/2 % of all MD registrations are historic (cars 20-25 years old an even smaller percentage than that).

Carol & Harry Yarnell, along with Franklin Gage, will be providing formal testimony on Tuesday, March 4th at 1 p.m. in the House Environmental Matters Committee. They are asking old car enthusiasts to attend the hearing and sit in the Gallery to show strength when they testify. Attendees would not have to speak, but if they could stand before the testimony, we could show the Committee that there is strength of interest in maintaining the 20-year historic tag status in Maryland. As written, the bill would mean that a car would have to be 25-years-old before being eligible for historic status. Franklin Gage and Steve McDonald of SEMA have been working with the bill's sponsor to maintain the current 20-year requirement, but if we don't show strength, there is a chance that we will lose this status.

If members are able to attend, recommended parking is at the Naval Academy Stadium (Route 50 East to Rowe Boulevard, turn right onto Taylor Avenue from Rowe Blvd to Visitors Gate 5 – you'll see a Blue Angels jet airplane on the hill inside the gate). Parking is \$5.00 for the day. Shuttle buses run every 10-15 minutes. Cost is \$2.00 each way (\$1.00 for senior citizens).

CLC-PR members who have vehicles registered in Maryland should be aware of both bills and their potential effect.

HOW CADILLAC IRKED VIEWERS WITH ITS OSCARS AD BY AIMEE PICCHI MONEYWATCH CBS INTERACTIVE INC. © MARCH 3, 2014

Cadillac appears to be taking a page from Oscar Wilde, aiming to provoke audiences into talking about the stodgy car brand at any cost. The **General Motors** (GM) brand is probably known best to younger consumers as the car in which their grandparents tooled around town, plush boats



that epitomized stylish luxury back in the 1960s and 1970s.

But now, the brand is striking out in a new direction, with an ad that appeals to unapologetic consumerism and the American work ethic, while also poking fun at Europeans for taking vacations during the entire month of August. The ad stars actor Neal McDonough of "Band of Brothers" strolling about a luxurious house, questioning why Americans work so hard.

"Because we're crazy, driven hardworking believers, that's why," McDonough says. "Those other countries think we're nuts. Whatever."

The upshot? Americans work hard so they can buy expensive things like the Cadillac ELR, he notes. Of course, one reason Americans work so hard is that many can't afford to take time off. Asked in a recent survey if they'd work for one less hour per day in exchange for a corresponding pay cut, about half said they couldn't afford it.

While the ad is sleek and stylish, it's also creating a strong backlash. Among the criticisms is that the spot reinforces negative stereotypes of the top 1 percent of U.S. earners, while also adding a heaping dose of xenophobia. While it first appeared in the opening ceremony of the Sochi Olympics, it also aired twice on ABC's telecast of the Academy Awards on Sunday, sparking new dialogue about the spot.





But for Cadillac, the advertisement, while polarizing, is likely achieving just what the brand hoped: Getting people talking again. As for negative perceptions of the 1 percent, it's fair to say that the people who hold those ideas (some of the remaining 99 percent) aren't likely to be in the market for a \$75,000 electric car.

"Those who hate this ad were never going to buy a Cadillac, anyway," wrote Mary Kubitskey, national advertising manager for GMC Division of GM, on Facebook, according to Deadline Detroit. "What's more American than working hard and owning stuff? I love the ballsy swagger for Cadillac."

Still, Cadillac is disavowing that the commercial is aimed at America's ultra-rich. The brand's advertising director Craig Bierley telling Advertising Age that the commercial is targeting customers with incomes of \$200,000. That's about four times as much as the median U.S. household income of \$53,046, but still below the \$370,000 required to crack the top 1 percent.

The potential Caddy buyer is someone with a "little bit of grit under their fingernails," Bierley told the publication. "These are people who haven't been given anything. Every part of success they've achieved has been earned through hard work and hustle."
