IN MEMORIAM: CARL STEIG BY RICHARD SILLS

On Monday August 25th, Carl Steig passed away at the age of 83. Carl served as CLC President from 1978-82 and then created and served as the club's first Chief Judge for 29 years until stepping down last year. With his passing, we have lost a true gentleman with an encyclopedic knowledge of Cadillacs, and a steadfast devotion to the CLC and its principles.

Judging is a subject that often gives rise to controversy, but no one ever questioned either the integrity or the knowledge that Carl brought to his responsibilities as Chief Judge. When awards were given out at our Grand National Meets, there was always a disclaimer that they were "subject to audit" -- because if Carl determined after the fact that some mistake had been made in the tallying of the scores, he wanted to make sure he could correct it. Once in a while, someone who had received a second or third prize at a GN award ceremony would get a letter in the mail later, stating that after the judging sheets were

re-checked, his car actually won a higher award -- and that higher award would be sent to the member, and his car would receive the appropriate recognition in the official list of GN winners.

My first introduction to Carl occurred at a GN meet back in the '80s, before I served in any position with the national CLC. One of the cars entered for judging was a freshly restored 1959 Eldorado Biarritz, which gleamed and glistened in every place one could look. When the award winners were called in that class, the 1959 Biarritz took a second place award, and a well preserved original Cadillac received the first place award. The owner of the freshly-restored car was crestfallen at not winning a 1st place award, and approached Carl to ask whether some mistake had been made. Carl was fully prepared for the inquiry. He graciously told the owner that his car was very beautiful, and complimented him on all the work he had done. But, he pointed out, "your car is shiny in many places where new Cadillacs were not shiny in 1959", and our Club's standards are based on authenticity. In other words, the car had been "overrestored", and as a result, it suffered some deductions. I remembered thinking that this result would happen in very few, if any, other clubs -- because over-restored cars winning the top awards was the usual way of the world at that time. This experience provided a positive picture of the Cadillac-LaSalle Club and what it stands for, and Carl's commitment to authenticity made a strong impression. (In the interest of full disclosure, the car that won the 1st place in that class was mine. That is why I remember this so well, but that is not the point of the story.)

In addition to his long run with the CLC, Carl was also a past President of the CCCA, as well as a long-time judge at the prestigious Pebble Beach concours. It is difficult to think of anyone who has made a greater contribution to our hobby. We will miss Carl greatly.



The CLC Potomac Region's car show sponsor, Capitol Cadillac in Greenbelt, Maryland, is celebrating its 80th Anniversary this year. The dealership was established in Washington, DC in 1934 by Floyd Akers, the grandfather of Daniel Jobe, its current President. About 1979, the dealership moved to its present facility in Greenbelt, Maryland and has been hosting CLC Potomac Region car shows since 1992. To commemorate the anniversary, the theme selected for this year's fall Capitol Cadillac / CLC Potomac Region car show is *"Celebrating Capitol Cadillac's 80th Anniversary"*. As part of the celebration, we are attempting to fill the showroom on Sunday October 26th with Cadillacs / LaSalles from 1934 – 1979 that were originally sold by Capitol Cadillac (all Cadillacs and LaSalles will be welcome at the show, but the ones sold new by Capitol Cadillac in 1979 or before will be the specially- featured cars.)

The Region is extending an invitation to known owners of Cadillacs / LaSalles that were sold new by Capitol Cadillac in 1979 or before. To celebrate the event, our commemorative program will highlight the history of Capitol Cadillac, and will include a description of each one of the featured cars pre-registered for the show. Each owner of a featured car will receive one of these programs, and also a framed certificate of appreciation for participating.

Car Show Rules

- Rain or Shine: The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- Safety: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class.
- Lunch Tickets: Each registered car owner will receive one free lunch ticket. The lunch ticket will entitle the person to receive the following from Red, Hot & Blue BBQ, who will be serving food:
 - 1) One Beef, Chicken or Pork Sandwich
 - 2) One Side order of Beans or Potato Salad and Cole Slaw
 - 3) One Drink including bottle water

Anyone without a lunch ticket will pay Red, Hot & Blue directly at the time of their purchase.

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Sandy thanked everyone for attending. He thanked Scot Minesinger and his family for making the arrangements and hosting the Region's annual picnic that was held last month. See comments below. SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Minutes from the July 2014 meeting were not read since they were published and distributed to all members in the July 2014 newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer's Report covered the time period from the June meeting to date. The Region's income was \$83.36. The total expenses for the same time period were \$251.16.

ACTIVITIES REPORT: The following activities were mentioned but no one at the meeting had attended any of these events:

1. Recent Events:

- Rohrersville / Boonsboro Fire Stations Car Show, Rohrersville, MD, Aug 2. Cliff Andersson attended this show and submitted photos for our newsletter. Two of the three Cadillacs on display are pictured right.
- Chesapeake Region AACA Summer Show at Howard County Fairgrounds; Howard County, MD, Aug 3. Ruth Synodinos reported that there was a disappointing number (less



than fifty cars) in attendance, but that may have been attributable to the poor weather on the morning of the show.





- 40th Annual All-GM Show, Montgomery College, Rockville MD, Aug 9. This year's show celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the Pontiac GTO and the Olds 442. PR members Daniel Jobe and Richard Sisson won awards for a 1972 GMC Suburban Carryall and a 1960 Pontiac Ventura, respectively.
- Potomac Region Annual Picnic: Our 10th Annual Pot-Luck Summer Picnic with Lincoln Mercury Friends. This was held on Saturday July 26 on the shores of Lake Manassas at the Sweet Virginia Bee Farm in Nokesville, VA. The weather was sunny and warm but not very humid. There was plenty of food and drink including a fresh baked pie baked and delivered by Scot's mother-in-law. There were at least ten Cadillacs and one Mercury on the grounds, along with the auction car. An article about the picnic was published in the July newsletter.



The CLC board meeting was held on Wednesday, July 9th. The normal Friday meeting day was moved to allow board members to be able to participate in a special tour to the Hemmings event.

- Lars Kneller officiated over his 8th and last board meeting as President of the CLC.
- Meetings typically now run approximately four hours, versus the previous six to eight hours, thanks to Lars' management style which included pre-posted reports and an insistence on board members not reading their reports at the meeting but rather giving very brief summaries and then holding a question and answer period which was kept to efficient standards.
- Dave Ritchie was promoted from Executive Vice President to President.



- All of the other executive level positions stayed as they were.
- Bill Anderson from our region was re-elected to the board for another two-year term, and Bill has also been appointed as the Chief Judge replacing long-serving Carl Stieg.
- Club member total as of May 31st: 7,062.
- At the end of the board meeting, Martina Butler organized a group photo with all board members surrounding Lars for the photo; Martina will send a framed photo of the event to Lars as a token of the board's appreciation for his four years of superb leadership.
- I reviewed the financials for the first eight months of the current fiscal year; through May 31, 2014. Jim Pittman told the board this was the first time in his memory the board had been able to have such current financial statements with which to work. I received a hearty round of applause.
- I also reviewed a projection of income and expenses for the final four months of the fiscal year. Added together with the first eight months of actuals, I estimated that we would end the fiscal year with a net income of between \$10,000 and \$12,000 compared to a net loss of \$23,131 for the prior fiscal year.
- The 2015 Winter Board Meeting will be held in Scottsdale, Arizona, again this year, with the meeting held on Saturday January 17th.









- The 2015 Grand National will be held in Brookfield, Wisconsin (outside of Milwaukee) from June 24th-27th. The host hotel will be the Sheraton with a nightly rate of \$104.00. The number to call for reservations is 262-364-1100.
- The 2016 Grand National will be held in Las Vegas from April 12th-16th at the Suncoast Hotel. First time in recent memory we will have a GN outside of summer.
- Ronnie Hux made a presentation to the board for the proposed joint Valley Forge and Potomac Region hosted Grand National for 2017. Reception to the proposal was overwhelmingly enthusiastic and approval was granted for the hotel selection process to begin.
- The CLC Museum and Research Center just issued the 258th Benefactor Gold Card.
- The CLCMRC is scheduling its Grand Opening for September 28th, which will be at the end of the 2014 National Driving Tour. Thanks to the following Potomac Region members listed below who




STONEWALL CADILLAC TURNS 45 CONTRIBUTORS: TARA CROSSON, WILLIAMSON HENDERSON, MURILEE MARTIN, LEIGH MCMANUS AND THE STONEWALL VETERANS ASSOCIATION

On Friday, June 27, 1969 at about 1 a.m., a routine-harassment-of-Gays police raid on the Stonewall Inn, a club in New York City known for its Gay clientele, touched off the not-so-routine Stonewall Rebellion, a series of demonstrations that are frequently cited as the start of the Gay Rights Movement in the United States and around the world. A 1969 Cadillac de Ville convertible had been parked with its top down, as usual, on the same block of the Stonewall Inn on Christopher Street -- only a stone's throw from the club's entrance -- by its owner Williamson Henderson. It was spared any damage in the chaos that followed. Once the rebellion was over, Henderson, who was at the forefront of the rebellion, was arrested and had his car impounded. The Cadillac was driven (not towed, as many think) by two plainclothes NYPD police officers to the old Sixth Precinct on Charles Street near the Hudson River in Greenwich Village. Despite the civil unrest, the car did not suffer any damage. In reality, there were no insurance claims filed by anyone for anything -- not even a car scratch.



Two days later, the car was released back to Williamson Henderson, who regularly drove it down the full length of Christopher Street from Greenwich Avenue to West Street (West Side Highway) at the Hudson River in Greenwich Village, New York. Many Gay and other people would yell out – as they still do today – "The Stonewall Car"! Over the years, the Cadillac has become pretty much a parade car, getting plenty of duty in the annual NYC Gay Pride parade and other events.

In the mid-1980s, this Cadillac led a parade in NYC sponsored by GM of over 50 Cadillacs when the new-sized Coupe and Sedan de Villes were introduced. In 1994, the "Stonewall Car" led the "Spirit of Stonewall March" from the legendary Stonewall Club in Greenwich Village through some narrow streets passing the historic Washington Square Arch, with the huge Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in the distant background, all the way up Fifth Avenue with cheering spectators, into Central Park. This famous car led hundreds of thousands of Gay, Lesbian, Bi-Sexual & Transgender (GLBT) people and their friends and supporters into the park, where hundreds of thousands had already congregated in anticipation of the biggest GLBT rally in history. Have you ever brought your car to be part of an event with a real million people? The "Stonewall Car" was the only car in the entire Central Park that glorious day, along with about 1.1 million people.

Here are some very interesting facts regarding the 1969 de Ville convertible. GM described this Cadillac as its "crown jewel". Right they were! Its weight is over 4,600 pounds (nearly 2 1/2 tons!); its length is 225 inches (nearly 19 feet long!); its width is 80 inches (over 6 1/2 feet wide); its height is 55 inches (with convertible top up); its wheelbase (the distance between axles) is 130 inches; and its massive, powerful, fuel-efficient, 375 horsepower, V-8 engine is 472 cubic inches at 4,400 rpm (revolutions per minute). It is one of the largest V-8 engines ever produced to power a passenger car! The Cadillac has the great standard-equipped power steering, power brakes, six-way power bench seat, power windows, AM/FM stereo radio, power radio antenna and, most importantly, power convertible top. The convertible top is made of white, triple-woven padded canvas with a real glass rear window. One option the car has which is rarely used is the automatic climate control system. When is the top up? Never! Not even in winter! The car is kept with the top down year-round and a custom canvas cover over it. The seating areas are white sierra ostrich-grain leather. The flooring is midnight black pile carpeting. The dashboard, door panels and rear seating area side panels have inlaid, designer grain wood. The entire "Stonewall Car" interior is original! The custom Vogue tires are extra-wide whitewalls. The wheel covers are solid chrome spokes. The fuel tank capacity is a whopping 26 gallons (plus one gallon reserve). The locked gas cap is hidden behind the rear license plate ("STONEWAL").

Over 16,000 of these classic Cadillac convertible cars -- a very large number for a luxury convertible -- were produced by General Motors Corporation with Body by Fisher. The huge chrome bumpers and massive front with cast aluminum "egg-crate" grille was used as a design model for Cadillac grilles for the following two-plus decades into the 1990s. The car introduced the innovative and safety-conscious wrap around cornering lights (now found, though less grandly, on almost every car). 1969 was the year that front seat headrests (restraints) became mandatory by law. Seatbelts were now required to have a push-button open/close mechanism. The 1969 Cadillac marked the public-wanted return of the dual horizontal headlights (after four years of the vertical, un-Cadillac, 'stacked' headlamps).





In 1959, back-tracking a decade, Cadillac had the incredibly unique, "bullet" tail-lights. Ten years later, it seems that they made a point to have the 1969 tail lamps be unique. 1969 was the only year that the Cadillac had the distinctive "lantern" tail-lights. They complemented and were built-in to the slowly sweeping, modified tail fin. In fact, virtually the only major difference between the 1969 and the 1970 Cadillacs (same body, same size, same stats, etc.) were the tail-lights. The 1970 returned to the well-known, long, vertical tail-lights.



Jeans The 1969 and 1970 Cadillacs (98% identical twins) were widely described as "muscle cars with tuxedos". It is most appropriate that the 1969 is both distinctive and 'different'. The ad slogan for the 1969 Cadillac was: "The pleasure of driving the only luxury convertible built in America!" Four decades later, that horn slogan still blows true -- and with even greater significance in America's auto industry.

The most frequently asked question about the "Stonewall Car" is: "What is the mileage?" At the turn of the millennium (2000), the "SW-Car" had an original mileage of 94,169 on New Year's Day. The mileage was only 94,894 original miles three years later as of January 1, 2003, actually

regarded as a very low figure considering the vehicular age. At 35 years, as of April 1, 2004, the mileage was only 94,954. In June 2005, the odometer read a low 95,169. Three years later, at the end of June 2008, the mileage read a mere 95,233 miles. Currently, the odometer shows approximately 95,300. Since 2000, only slightly more than 1,000 miles have been added to this restricted-mileage "historical" vehicle. The engine is original and has had absolutely nothing overhauled. It even has the original glass window cleaner bottle and mount adjacent to the engine!

The "Stonewall Car", now owned by the STONEWALL Veterans' Association (SVA), has appeared in several movies, television commercials, print ads and photo shoots. It was used in the popular promotional poster for both the premiere of "Stonewall: The Play" in 1994 and "Stonewall" (the movie) in 1996. Since the "Stonewall Car" had a professional exterior restoration in mid-1999, SVA members voted unanimously to again make the car available (after a 20-year hiatus) to be 'leased' -- with SVA supervision -- for films, commercials, print ads, editorials and videos. It also gets plenty of duty in the annual NYC Gay Pride parades and other events, especially this year, as the car turns 45, the Stonewall Rebellion marks its 45th anniversary and the 45th annual parade.

The S.V.A. owns, manages, garages, maintains and insures the valuable 1969 "Stonewall Car"! Few realize the amount of necessary expenses associated with the classic car. All of these decades, the S.V.A. has met the financial responsibilities alone. After 45 years, enough is enough!

Monies raised shall be directed exclusively for car costs including maintenance, garaging, insurance, license plates, inspection, tires, parts, fuel, oil, etc. in addition to some planned restorations and pro-active and decorative replacement of parts on and in the SW-car.
