LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

March 29, 2015

I just got the April "Chronicle" with a piece (and a photo) on the "1956 Cadillac Valkyrie by Brooks Stevens" that was "designed ... on a 1956 (Cadillac) Chassis". In my own research about this (these?) cars, it is said the car was shown at the 1954 Paris salon (October 1954) so I guess the Cadillac chassis was more likely from 1955. In SIA magazine (Special Interest Automobiles) for Jan-Feb 1974, the authors assert that **six** "Valkyries"'s were built and shown (?) at the Paris Salon of 1954 (at least **two** have survived, including Joe's car).

A press release dated October 6, 1954, reads [in French]: "THE VALKYRIE" WILL BE AT THE SALON – Here is "The Valkyrie", created by the American stylist, Brooks Stevens, who started off with the chassis and mechanical components of a Cadillac, of which he retained the V-8 engine. Hood vents allow hot air to be evacuated from the engine [compartment]. The panoramic windshield extends quite far back. Also of note is the "V"-shaped grille that acts also as the bumper, and the wide doors that carry the wind vents and main door glass."

A second press release also dated October 6, 1954, reads [again in French] (PARIS BUREAU): "VALKYRIE AT THE SALON – PARIS – The latest Cadillac creation presented at the automobile Salon is not a "futuristic" car. It's a chassis fitted with a V-8 motor, having coachwork by the German coach-builder, Spohn, from a design by the American designer Brooks Stevens. Its notable feature is the "V"-shaped grille. The (roof) dome is removable; it may be replaced at will with a convertible top, stored in the rear."

A third press release from the French monthly magazine, l'Automobile, for December 1954 reads: "No other car has attracted as much curiosity at the last Salon as the VALKYRIE CADILLAC, designed and built according to the plans of the American stylist Brooks Stevens. Admired or spurned, in any event Brooks Stevens' creation had the merit of bringing its author to the attention of the French public; he is considered in the United States as one of the leading industrial designers."

As an architect, designer of locomotives, refrigerators, household wares, automobiles, outboard motors, lawn mowers, etc., Stevens is considered in the USA as the first heir to Raymond Loewy. Among his accomplishments are: the design of the body of the first civilian jeep, the Cadillac "Valkyrie" (star of the last Paris Show), and the "Excalibur"... awarded in New York the title of most beautiful "reasonably priced" sports car."

Also in the news, a photo of Richard Sisson's '54 Eldorado illustrated the article by columnist John Kelly in today's [April 20, 2015] *Washington Post*.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: There are no minutes from the March 2015 meeting at USA Parts as the meeting was informal and most of the discussion was about the 2017 Grand National. A motion was passed for the Region to pay the cost of a vendor space for USA Parts Supply at the 2017 GN as thanks for USA Parts Supply hosting our Region meeting numerous times.

Car Show Rules

- <u>Rain or Shine</u>: The car show will take place rain or shine. No refunds.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the showroom floor or show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. There will be no parking on the grassy areas whatsoever, due to sprinkler heads and possible rut damage. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st, 2nd and 3rd place awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class.
- Lunch Tickets: Each registered car owner will receive one free lunch ticket. The lunch ticket will entitle the person to receive the following from **Red**, **Hot & Blue BBQ**, who will be serving food:
 - 1) One Beef, Chicken or Pork Sandwich
 - 2) One Side order of Beans or Potato Salad and Cole Slaw
 - 3) One Drink including bottle water

Anyone without a lunch ticket will pay Red, Hot & Blue directly at the time of their purchase.

LAMESA, TX — She's a bit rusty, but her new owners don't plan to let her stay that way long.

Plus, Billy Cork and Luke Cork understand 40 years on top of a building can do that to a ride.

The father-and-son team spent Tuesday morning helping bring down Lamesa's iconic rooftop Cadillac. They purchased the 1955 Coupe de Ville for an undisclosed price, and now plan to restore it.

"It's time for this car to have some fun," Luke Cork said.

The project is great for some family bonding, he added.

"That's really what it's about for us," he said.

The Corks recruited help from Bobby Norvell, a fellow auto enthusiast and member of their Rust Inc. car club. While a longtime crane operator, he admitted to being a novice at removing cars from roofs.

"This will be my first one," he said.

Norvell surrounded the Caddy with a spreader beam. From the roof, the Corks attached the vehicle to an undercarriage,

then hooked the spreader beam to the length of the car. Norvell picked it straight up, then carefully lowered it to an awaiting trailer.













"I think Norvell's crane did an excellent job," Billy Cork said. "It went exceptionally nice."

The car — and its eye-catching location — are an iconic piece of Lamesa's history, lifelong resident Nolen Cope said.

"It was a landmark," he said.

The Country Store, the building at which the car spent the past four decades, sells supplies such as crop seeds and livestock feed. Before that, it was a powdered milk factory.

Original owner Gordon Waldrop died a few years ago, Cope said.

Now, Billy and Luke are assessing the Cadillac to determine the best ways to return it to driving condition.

"We'll have to assess the car to see what we'll do, but the car will remain intact with Rust Inc. and will eventually be on the road again," Luke Cork said. "I think it's gonna be sentimental to us like it was to them. We all agree it needs a better life than being in hailstorms."

Specific plans such as car show appearances are in the brainstorming stages.

"This car's gonna be restored, have a new home and put back

in the streets," Billy Cork said. "Who knows what the future holds? We may see it on top of another building some day."
