



The Potomac Region CLC held its 24th Annual Spring Car Show on May 3, 2015 at Capitol Cadillac, Greenbelt, Maryland. The day was sunny, with temperatures in the 70s. 64 Cadillacs and LaSalles were on display, ranging from 1930 to 2008, and they came from Maryland, Virginia, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and the District of Columbia.

Thanks to Daniel Jobe, Lisa Diehl and Capitol Cadillac plus all the members who volunteered to help with the show including Bill Hilliard, Robert Meekins, Chuck & Debbie Piel, Dan Ruby, Richard Sills, Christopher Winter and others. Special appreciation also goes to auctioneer George Boxley and his helpers who included Rita Bial-Boxley, Jim Govoni, Harry Scott, Mary Moscati and others, along with the donors of the items, including Ronnie Hux and the Northern Virginia Chapter of the Early Ford V-8 Club members Jim McDaniel, John Sweet and Gay Harrington who donated several Cadillac & LaSalle publications to our automobilia auction. The publications were from a collection of one of their late members, Dick Lebkicker (pictured right). The items included a 1939 Cadillac/LaSalle Shop Manual and a 1968 Cadillac data book, the latter of which sold to a phone bidder in California.

According to his fellow members in the Ford club, Dick exemplified the antique car hobby at its best. He is remembered as a man who had an infinite reservoir of mechanical knowledge and who would gladly set aside his own projects to come to the aid of a club member who needed help. Dick was a "go to guy" for many old car problems. Dick's son wanted his Dad's collection of literature to go to those who would appreciate it and could put it to good use. Jim, John and Gay thought of us for the Cadillac and LaSalle literature, and we are thankful for their generosity.














At this show, we introduced a new award, the Young Judges' Award. It is often debated

Best Pre War was awarded to former Potomac Region Director Bill Thomas, Warrenton, VA, for his 1941 Series 61 Sedan, which was previously owned by former Valley Forge Region Director Marty Watkins (pictured bottom left). It is safe to say that the car is in good hands, something that all of us want for the cars we have cherished over the years.



As the case with the 2014 Fall Car Show, the best Post War category was divided into an early period (1946-1964) and a late period (1965-present). 1964 seems the natural cut-off point for early as it represents the last year of the iconic Cadillac fins (except for the 1965 Series 75 Fleetwood which used the finned-body from 1964). The winner of the Best Post War (Early) was Bill Harrison, Laurel, MD, for his 1964 Eldorado that he recently purchased from Daniel Jobe. The Best Post War (late) award recipient was Ronnie Hux, Avondale, PA, for his nationally-award winning 1974 Eldorado convertible.

It would be a shame to relegate extraordinary cars to an ordinary garage: Prolific collector Steve Plunkett gives these cars the space they deserve



In the 1930s, new Cadillacs were unveiled to the public during glitzy reveals in the ornate Waldorf Astoria ballroom in New York. It must have been quite a sight to see an enormous V16 Cadillac parked on top of a Persian rug while flashbulbs burst incessantly around it. Philanthropist and avid car collector Steve Plunkett of London, Ont., made it his goal to recreate some of that glamour when he set out to design his own personal garage.

Plunkett is one of the world's most prolific Cadillac collectors — he has 86 cars and most of those are Cadillacs with a few Buicks and Oldsmobiles thrown in for variety. A full list of the cars housed in the collection can be found on Plunkett's website at

There are several garages on the property, but the crown jewel is the garage where his 1930s and '40s Cadillacs are kept. Named the "Fleetwood Auto Salon," the garage houses just more than a dozen of his most prized Cadillacs.





The inside of the Fleetwood Auto Salon was modelled after the same art decostyle Waldorf Astoria ballroom that was host to many of his cars when they were brand new and being unveiled for the first time. How else would you display such beautiful cars? It would be a shame to relegate extraordinary cars to an ordinary garage, so Plunkett gives these cars the space they deserve.

Few of the cars in his pristine collection are shorter than 18 feet long and none have any less than eight cylinders (except for one primitive 1907 Cadillac that sports a single-cylinder engine). Cadillacs of the 1930s were large, powerful and fantastically expensive. Proud hood badges denote whether there are 16, 12 or eight cylinders softly humming under the long, polished hoods. The graceful hood ornaments on these cars stand at roughly chest height for most and they sit atop imposingly tall chrome arilles.





One car in the huge collection that Plunkett is particularly fond of is his one-of-one 1934 Cadillac convertible coupe. The mammoth coupe's 19-foot length made it one of the longest cars in the world at the time. Despite being built during the depth of the Great Depression, the Caddy coupe is powered by a gas-swilling 7.4-litre V16 engine that made the car nearly as fast as a Duesenberg. All those cylinders and cubic inches resulted in 140 horsepower, which was nearly double what a contemporary Ford V8 made. 15







Another unique one-off in the collection is the stunning 1949 Cadillac Coupe DeVille prototype (pictured left). It was custom built to wow audiences at GM's "Transport Unlimited" show in 1949 at the Waldorf Astoria. The stunning coupe was viewed by 300,000 eager showgoers in New York and another 300,000 in Detroit. It is the first car to feature a curved, onepiece windshield and

the public's positive reaction to the car convinced Cadillac to rush the Coupe DeVille into production for late 1949.

Despite the tremendous rarity and value of the cars, Plunkett drives them regularly on the roads surrounding his home. He says that the old Caddys have a "solid feel" on the road and that cars made before 1934 aren't very comfortable above 90 km/h. He acknowledges that sitting unused is a terrible thing to do to a car and he tries to drive two to three a day when the weather is cooperating. In all, he estimates that he puts about 100 kilometres on each car annually and he doesn't plan to stop driving them any time soon.

I encourage everyone in the Potomac Region to make plans now to attend the VFR's Spring Show at Delaware Cadillac and support our co-host of the 2017 Grand National.
