**DIRECTOR'S REMARKS:** Dan thanked everyone for attending. He directed everyone's attention to the October 2019 issue of *The Self-Starter* featuring articles about the Region's Spring Show and about the 85th Anniversary of Capitol Cadillac. He welcomed our guest to the meeting, Benaiah, and explained the CLC and the Potomac Region. Also, Dan pointed out to everyone that our advertising program of posting cars for sale in our newsletter and on our website has proven to be successful with four cars sold in just the past two months.

**SECRETARY'S REPORT:** The Minutes from the September 2019 meeting were not read since they were published and distributed to all members in the October 2019 newsletter.

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** The Treasurer's Report covered the time period from the September 2019 meeting to date. The Region's income was \$225.37, including a donation from former Region member Joe Pipkin, whose car was sold recently via the Region's ads. The expenses for the same time period were \$1,225.06, nearly half of which was for the picnic. Other expenses include the food & drinks for the Sept. Region meeting and the supplies and mailing costs for the 2020 membership renewals.

**MEMBERSHIP REPORT:** Our 2019 membership is 180. The 2020 membership renewal forms have been US mailed to over 130 members in good standing who haven't pre-paid for 2020. We encourage members to send their 2020 dues and renewal forms to Bill Hilliard before the December 15th deadline.

## FALL FESTIVAL: ONE CADILLAC OF AN EVENT BY ANGELO VAN BOGART, EDITOR OLD CARS OCTOBER 24, 2019

The brake pads of my rental car are still cooling from last week-end's trip to the Cadillac & LaSalle Museum & Research Center's annual Fall Festival & Concours d'Elegance. This great event is held at the museum, which is located on the grounds of the Gilmore Car Museum in Hickory Corners, Mich. I've attended this great event many times over the past few years, but this was the first event here or elsewhere that I noticed an interesting flip in the demographics of attendees — there seemed to be at least as many attendees in the 50-and-under category as there were in the 50-and-older category.

The result of this younger demographic was "younger" Cadillacs. There were many 1970s, 1980s and early and mid-1990s Cadillacs on display in addition to prewar favorites and '50s Cadillacs that are the current mainstay of the hobby. To their credit, these relatively young hobbyists had beautiful cars in stock condition, often with incredibly low miles. In talking to them, even the twenty-somethings were as concerned with preservation, condition and authenticity as the longtime hobbyists who originally formed the club back in 1958. It made me very pleased to see

that the Cadillac & LaSalle Club would have a solid base of members well after my last drive.

One of the principals who attracted hobbyists young and old to the Fall Festival was *Old Cars* "Resto Basics" columnist Bill Anderson, who serves as president and chairman of the board for the Cadillac & LaSalle Museum & Research Center. Since the Fall Festival is a fund raiser for the museum, Anderson works diligently to make the event a stop for hobbyists and I was thoroughly impressed. Among the judges were one dozen automotive designers, each of them with experience designing Cadillacs and their components over the years. These judges included the famous Wayne Kady, whose design became the 1971 Eldorado, and Maurizio Corbi of coachbuilder Pininfarina, who came all of the way from Italy to participate.

The event also included presentations by current and former Cadillac staff; rides in vintage Cadillacs; old and new Cadillac concept cars (including the very first and very last Cadillac two-door hardtop prototypes); a display of new vehicles by Cadillac; and a garage sale of Cadillac and LaSalle-related items by the museum. That was all in addition to the show car field and the hundreds of vehicles in the multiple museums on the Gilmore Car Museum campus. This is an event worthy of the Cadillacs and LaSalles it celebrates. I plan to return next year, and if the brake system is fully functioning on my '55 Cadillac by next September, I'll even be there with an old car. I hope to see you there with your old car, too.

# 44TH ANNUAL EDGAR ROHR MEMORIAL ANTIQUE AUTO SHOW STORY AND PHOTOS BY LYNN GARDNER & SANDY KEMPER

The AACA Bull Run Region hosted its 44th Annual Edgar Rohr Memorial Antique Auto Show on Saturday, September 21. The show is held on the grounds of the Manassas Museum (also known as Baldwin Park) and extends to adjacent Prince William Street and the parking lot of the Train Station in the historic old town area of Manassas, Virginia. It was a sunny and warm day with temperatures in the 80s – perfect for the approximately 150 cars in attendance.

The majority of the cars were antiques and classics, but there was a section devoted to street rods and modified cars, most of which were very exotic. There were only three Cadillacs in the antique car area and these were all convertibles and owned by CLC-Potomac Region members (see photos right): Bill Sessler's 1946 Series 62 Convertible, Tom McQueen's 1975 Eldorado Convertible and Lynn Gardner's 1976 Eldorado Convertible. However there was an eyecatching 1964 Cadillac in the modified section (pictured below).



The Edgar Rohr Car Show allows participants and spectators alike to enjoy free admission to the Manassas Museum. And just one block away, a Farmer's Market and an international food festival offer a wide selection of food choices. ## BOWMAN CLASSIC CAR MUSEUM BY SANDY KEMPER

On Saturday, September 14, the Francis Scott Key Chapter of the AACA Sugarloaf Mountain Region organized a tour of the Bowman Collection of cars and trucks in Williamsport, Maryland, just southwest of Hagerstown. They arranged a meeting place for participants in Middletown, Maryland. The route from Middletown to the Bowman facilities in Williamsport was designed to be on two-lane roads, avoiding Interstate 70, so classic cars were encouraged. But on that Saturday morning there were rain showers and almost everyone had driven their everyday car. Nevertheless the caravan left Middletwon following a 1965 Corvair.

D. M. Bowman Inc. is a diversified company primarily providing trucking, warehousing and logistics. Its owner, Don Bowman has amassed a wonderful collection of classic cars. According to Don, "Most of my cars were ones that I admired as a kid or heard stories about. My first car was a 1933 Ford which I bought and sold before I got my license to drive. My first new car was a 1966 Pontiac, which is here in my collection. In 1979, I got a chance to buy a Model A Ford, which was the start of my collection of that type of car. Collecting cars has taken me all over the country meeting a lot of nice people."





Bowman's collection, also known as his museum) of approximately 85 cars and trucks is located in three buildings. All of the cars are in one spacious, well-lit building. As one enters this building there is a small (as compared to the rest of the facility) reception room with a 1906 Ford Model N to whet one's appetite. Entering the main collection area, the cars are arranged mostly by year, but there are subgroupings, separated by assemblages of gasoline pumps, petroliana and household appliances from the periods of the nearby cars.

Also, there is one distinct sub-grouping of cars. There is a Corvette room in which there are eight Corvettes spanning the model years 1954–2014 and the Corvette "generations" (i.e. C1, C2, etc.).





Nearly every car has an attractive stanchion sign in front of it describing the specifications of the car (year, model, engine, wheelbase, etc.) along with the history of Mr. Bowman's relationship with the car (when acquired, why, etc.) It was interesting to read that Don drove quite a few of his cars before placing them in his museum. There are seven Cadillacs (although a few of the stanchion signs had "Cadallac" on them) in the collection. The oldest was a 1976 Eldorado and the newest a 2009 XLR.

The cars are parked without the usual rope barriers surrounding them found in many auto museums. And there is enough distance between each of them and the walls to permit one to walk around the cars. One small detail in the collection that caught the eyes of several of us on our tour were the drip "pans" under some of the cars. These looked like small dollies or garage creepers with materials affixed to catch the drips and wheels to provide easy removal.

Most of the trucks in the collection are housed in two other buildings from the main museum. One of the buildings displays multiple semitrucks from different decades showing the changes in these vehicles over time. The other truck building also features an assortment of trucks from different eras. This





collection highlights the variety of truck types (e.g. pickup, cab over, van). Also noteworthy in this building is the huge number of display cases lining the walls containing thousands of model and toy vehicles.

If the opportunity arises for a tour of the Bowman Collection, don't miss it. It's a delight for a car or truck lover.


