Our space will be in the same prime location as prior years: at the top of the escalator from the show entrance, just outside the main exhibition hall.






A DREAM COME TRUE BY LARRY GOOD

In 2017 while celebrating the New Year in the sweltering heat of summer in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, I researched classic post-war cars to find an investment project, a grand finale in my retirement. (I'd reached my limit on nostalgic money losers... dumped a garage full that I'd collected for half a century and were going nowhere.) The conclusion to my homework was the 1953 Eldorado.

Later that year, my wife, Maia, and I happened to be in California for the birth of a couple of grandchildren. While waiting, we went to visit all the '53 Eldorado owners who would have us. One Cadillac & LaSalle Club member didn't want to show his car because it was unrestored and unpresentable. I assured him I'd love to see it in its natural state and he relented. What we saw was a very rusty basket case, exactly what I was looking for, but he wasn't selling. Cadillac originally delivered this Eldorado, #352, to a dealer in Connecticut the day before the Hydramatic-transmission plant fire in Livonia, MI. (From Wikipedia: On August 12, 1953, fire



destroyed GM's state-ofthe-art transmission assembly plant in Livonia, MI, causing \$50 million in damage – almost \$500 million in today's dollars. It was the most destructive industrial fire in American history – photo courtesy of GM).

My new friend bought this particular one because the numbers matched and all unique Eldorado parts were said to be present. I wanted a rusty car to save money on the purchase

because I knew that the shop near our other home in the Republic of Georgia could repair the rust for a song. They had already done two cars for me.

A few months later, the owner wrote to me and asked if I was still interested in buying his '53 Eldorado because he had found another project that he wanted more. Within minutes we agreed on a price, and he shipped the car to New Jersey where I expected to have some mechanical restoration take place. After worrying that I might never find a '53 Eldorado as long as I live, I suddenly had one!





On the advice of Potomac Region members, I gave the engine to Penn-Dutch Restoration Services in Glen Rock, PA to rebuild (see below). They have won numerous top awards in shows everywhere. At this point, the car's beauty is out of sight under the hood.

The general contractor on the job is Steve's Auto in Swartswood, NJ. Twenty years ago Steve did my '47 Cadillac sedan (6109) and it won a blue ribbon at the CLC's 2002 Grand National in Dearborn, MI commemorating Cadillac's 100th Anniversary. In addition, his work has won several awards at Pebble Beach, including one Best of Show.

Steve did the rest of the Eldorado's mechanical restoration and prepared the car for shipment overseas. With the temporary glass packs and rusty exterior the car looks headed for a demolition derby, not a Grand National. Click the YouTube links below to see videos of the car.

The car will arrive in Georgia in January and go straight to Garage Gold in Eniseli for body and paint work. See video on the shop from the TV show Good Morning Georgia at https://youtu.be/FtBzDXIPIpE (pictured left).

There are no high-end chrome platers in Georgia, so most of the chrome will be shipped to neighboring Armenia, where I found a modern, new plating shop in Yerevan. The Kelsey-Hayes wheels and smaller Eldorado specific trim are staying behind to be finished by specialists in the U.S.

The numbers on my #352 do match, except for the key. (On my `47-6109 all numbers match down to the key!) However, we found that some Eldorado specific parts were missing anyway. So now we're scrambling to find them. Does anybody have a Trico wiper motor #CHP-10-21 for sale?

The reason for taking some of the work overseas is simple economics. At labor rates in the Caucasus countries, one can save \$50-\$75k on a restoration. Transportation back and forth is well under \$10k. Maia and I have an apartment in Georgia, so having their local craftsmen work on my car enhances the quality of retirement life beyond all expectations.

Our goal is a 100-point, factory-authentic 1953 Eldorado by 2021. If all goes according to plan, we will unveil it at the CLC Grand National in Albuquerque, NM. For one day in history, I hope to have the best 1953 Eldorado in the world. After I drive it off the field, the title is up for grabs. I won't care anymore; I just want that one moment! Good wishes and positive thoughts are welcomed.

The 1932 Cadillac adopted streamlined design for the first time, albeit with a subtle and gentle touch, including a longer hood and lowered body, as well as a new flat grille incorporated into the radiator shell, curved steel running boards, and torpedo-shaped headlights. The trunk on the town sedan, town coupe and five-passenger convertible coupe was integral with the body. The vision of the driver was improved by 30 percent as a result of the elimination of the outside visor and the construction of a 12 degree sloping windshield and corner posts. Extensive mechanical changes brought the drivability of the car into the modern era, as well, including a boxed steel frame, adjustable shock absorbers, reduced final drive, and Triple-Silent synchromesh manual transmission. This was a beautiful road automobile, especially with the lovely convertible coupe bodywork.

This handsome Fisher-bodied convertible coupe was delivered by the **Kempton Cadillac Corporation of Washington, D.C.**, on May 16, 1932, with the build sheet notation "Tag Mrs. Trapnell – Rush Sold," indicating that it had been already been sold and the new owner, Mrs. Trapnell, was waiting. It was finished in the delightfully named Niagara Blue with Deep Danube Dusk door "saddles," Tokio Ivory striping, and black fenders and chassis, and had a fine roster of optional accessories, including dual side-mounted spares with metal covers, trunk rack, dual mirrors, and the Heron radiator mascot.

In 1955 the car was discovered in Kansas and brought to the Bay Area of Northern California by Eddie Jay. Mr. Jay refurbished the car in the late 1960s or early 1970s; as it was a good solid original automobile, this work appears to have been limited largely to mechanical maintenance and a thorough cosmetic refinishing, including new aubergine (Eggplant) paint on the body, black fenders, black leather interior, and a tan top. Mr. Jay maintained his Cadillac until 1999, at which point it was acquired





by the current owner in Northern California.

The Cadillac has continued to be well-maintained, and close inspection indicates that the restoration has held up extremely well for its age; the car retains such irreplaceable original features as the original headlamp and taillight lenses, the original dashboard, and the original gauges, all in fine condition. The original lubrication tag is present as is the original body tag, and even the original delivery tag from Kempton Cadillac! Consistently used on many regional tours and properly looked-after, the car recently received a new wiring loom. It is further accompanied by an original owner's manual and shop manual, which should be of much interest to a new caretaker, and a copy of the original build sheet. Ideal for continued enjoyment in CCCA CARavans and other touring events, this is a satisfying enthusiast-owned Cadillac and a delight to drive and enjoy.











Kempton Cadillac Corporation was the predecessor to Capitol Cadillac as the Washington, D.C. Cadillac dealership/distributor. They were in existence from 1931-1934. In November 1933, Robert Morris Kempton, the dealership's president, sent a key ring with President Franklin Delano Roosevelt's monogram to the White House for use with the new V-16 Cadillac that they delivered. The gift was acknowledged in a return letter from Missy LeHand, FDR's Private Secretary (see above).

On January 11, 1934, Kempton Cadillac ran a large ad in *The Washington Post* introducing the new 1934 Cadillac and LaSalle with their distinctive bi-plane bumpers (pictured left).

Ironically the ad's title stated that *Progress Means Change!..., and change was soon to occur. On April 15, 1934, The Post reported some news: "Akers to Open Cadillac Agency," ending Kempton Cadillac's time as a

dealer/distributor.

THE ECTO-1 HEARSE IN THE NEW GHOSTBUSTERS FLICK
IS ACTUALLY THE ONCE-NEGLECTED ECTO-1A

With every new Ghostbusters film, it seems we're introduced to yet another incarnation of the Ecto-1, perhaps the world's most famous Cadillac-based hearse. Except the latest version, as seen in the recently released trailer for "Ghostbusters: Afterlife," apparently recycles an earlier version that was once literally headed to the scrapheap.



"The main car that was the Ecto-1A has in fact been repurposed as one of three Ecto-1 cars for the new movie," said AJ Quick, webmaster for the Ghostbusters Fans website and one of the instigators of the fan petition intended to save Ecto-1A from the crusher six years ago.

For the first two Ghostbusters films, Sony used three different 1959 Cadillac Miller-Meteor hearses: one that portrayed the unmodified heap that Ray Stantz bought, one that portrayed Ecto-1 in the 1984 film, and a third that portrayed Ecto-1A in the 1989 sequel, the latter two designed by Stephen Dane.





Ecto-1, as lore goes, actually died on the Brooklyn Bridge during filming for the sequel. Still, Sony treated it to a full restoration and has displayed it in various venues, including the Petersen Automobile Museum in 2014, all the while leaving the Ecto-1A to languish on a Sony backlot after a proposed restoration fell through in 2007.

While Sony didn't appear to respond directly to the petition – and definitely didn't sell Ecto-1A to Ghostbusters Fans for its scrap value – Quick claims that the petition did motivate Sony to put Ecto-1A into storage. "Certainly the petition helped cement the idea that this was stuff that needed to be kept," he said.

According to Quick, Sony converted the former Ecto-1A into a reasonable facsimile of the Ecto-1A (minus the ladder swapped to the driver's side and the rear passenger door converted to suicide opening for the gunner's seat) for "Afterlife" and outfitted two more Cadillac Miller-Meteor hearses for shooting; all three now have GM LS V-8s under their hoods. The restored Ecto-1 wasn't used for filming the new movie, Quick said, and all the parts from the Ecto-1A "are still around and in good hands." The images below are from the movie trailer. 

The LaSalle has no back-seat, but instead drop-down "opera" seats on either side – Other specs include a banjo steering wheel, AM radio, large yellow fog lights, brown leather seats and radial wide-white wall tires – Powered by a Cadillac V-8 L-head 125 horsepower engine w/ Syncro-Mesh transmission and torsion ride stabilizers – Since purchased in 2006, the manifold was fixed – Sweet car that drives so nice – Top is proper tan canvas – Passenger door window is cracked, but functions OK – To help prevent vapor lock, the exhaust manifold has been wrapped with insulation, which seems to do the job – Trunk lid has a pair of support arms to hold it when open – One of the supports has a defective cog, which makes it difficult to close the lid when opened fully – No luck trying to find a replacement or getting it repaired
