



- <u>Rain Date</u>: There is no rain date for this show. If inclement weather causes a cancellation, an email will be sent to all preregistered attendees (email address required on registration form) and region members. In addition, an announcement will be
 posted on the club's website. Rules of participation will be subject to any COVID-related restrictions by the county or dealership,
 if any, in effect on show date.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the show field parking lot. **The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field.** It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- <u>Judging / Parking Rules</u>: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st and 2nd awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class depending upon the number of vehicles registered in each class.
- Food and Drink: A food vendor will be on-site. All participants and guests are responsible for their own food and beverages.

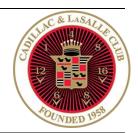






LESSONS LEARNED: 1947 CARBURETOR REPLACEMENT BY LUIS ARANDA PHOTOS BY JUAN ARANDA AND LUIS ARANDA

In 2020, I became the third caretaker of Dad's 1947 Cadillac Fleetwood Series 60 Special. Dad became the second one in 1966 when the car had 8,000 miles. Now she has a whopping 37,000 miles and is still all original.

Over the past year, I've learned more about the Stromburg AAV-26 carburetor. Last year, I put an older rebuilt carburetor on the '47 and sent the one I removed out to be rebuilt. When the rebuilt carburetor was returned, it included a "Warning" note that said contaminates were found in the carb and recommended the fuel system be serviced, so as not to void the warranty. However, they didn't identify what the contaminates were.



After contemplating various opinions to address the "warning" about contaminates in the fuel, I decided to start with a *fresh* fuel system. I bought a new gas tank, sending unit, straps, etc. What I found when I drained the gas was not what I expected from a 74-year-old gas tank. The fuel was not dirty or rusty and the drain plug didn't have any rust or crud. The most remarkable finding reversed my decision to replace the tank. While looking above the leaf spring, I can still read the stenciled part number on the top half of the tank. After seeing the part number and how clean the drained fuel was (pictured right), my decision was obvious: *I'll keep the factory tank in* place. I put 10 gallons of 93 octane gas into the tank, ran the motor for a while to flush out any old gas before replacing the carburetor.



When switching carburetors, I had a choice between two brass "screen" type filters in my collection of parts. One was just a flat "disk" and the other one was rolled into a "tube". *Hmm*, which one is correct? As it turns out, the






rolled screen is the correct filter.





After studying the fuel inlet port where the 45° brass elbow screws into the back of carburetor, I see the raised, tapered ring molded on the back of the fuel inlet port as seen in the photo below. This ring is in-line with the incoming fuel as it enters the carburetor. The rolled filter fits over the ring on one end and into the end of the 45° brass elbow as it is screwed into the port of the carburetor. Using a bright light, I can see the orifice along the sidewall of the fuel inlet port. So, now I understand the fuel flows thru the center of the rolled filter, outward filling the port and downward into the carburetor via the orifice on the sidewall of the port.







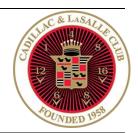

Another lesson learned is **do not use Teflon tape on fuel lines**. I found pieces of tape inside the fuel port! I used **SEAL-ALL** on all threaded fittings. It's only about \$7.00 +/- at an auto parts store and it looks much better.

Now, I have an extra gas tank for spare parts and hopefully won't ever need it, but I'll save it for the next caretaker. The 'ole girl' runs good now with the newly rebuilt carburetor, so now it's time to take the 'old man' out for a drive on an upcoming nice day. Dad has always claimed the car had never been purposely driven in bad weather (before and after he bought it), and it has been caught in the rain only three times since 1966!



THE CHESAPEAKE CADILLAC COMPANY BY JULIAN FROST

As you drive up Charles Street in Baltimore, MD through Old Goucher, you might notice some odd details on the facade of the neighborhood Safeway. A carved sentinel eagle keeps watch, and the word "CADILLAC" is etched onto a stone arch over the market's main entrance. These curiosities were preserved from what once occupied this site.

In the early years of the Great Depression, the Chesapeake Cadillac Company constructed an Art Deco showroom building at 2400 N. Charles Street. Art Deco is a design movement popularized in the 1920s, its architecture characterized by elegant, streamlined surfaces and patterns. This uniform style evokes the man-made and reflects a faith in modern technology and machinery.





The story goes that the showroom's site was selected by the famous World War I flying ace Eddie Rickenbacker. Before winning 26 aerial combat duels in Europe and earning a Medal of Honor, Rickenbacker had already established himself in the States as a prodigious racecar driver and automobile designer. When Rickenbacker returned home as a war hero, he had boundless access to entrepreneurial ventures and employment. In the late '20s, as a general manager of sales for General Motors' Cadillac division, Rickenbacker went up in a plane to scout sites that would "tap Baltimore's affluent neighborhoods." As he approached the intersection of Charles Street and University Parkway, he said, "You want to be as close to this area as possible."



Chesapeake Cadillac, which counted Frank Robinson, Glenn L. Martin, Dorothy Lamour, and T. Rowe Price among its clients, remained on Charles Street until 1995. This made it one of the last dealerships in Baltimore to haul out to the suburbs of Baltimore County. This exodus of businesses from the city had begun in the mid-20th century, in response to a strong, new customer base of white families who had moved en masse to the suburbs. The company's plans to move to Cockeysville's car dealership corridor were in the works before Safeway proposed building there in 1994—it was known that suburban locations were more lucrative. The company exists today in Cockeysville, MD as Frankel & Chesapeake Cadillac.

When Safeway proposed building a store here in 1994, public opinion was split. Advocates for historical preservation, including Donna Beth Joy Shapiro, vice president of Baltimore Heritage at the time, argued that a supermarket and its parking lot would break up the traditional streetscape, worsen traffic, and waste architecturally significant buildings. Safeway's arrival "pulled the rug out from under" a local development team's plans to bring a supermarket to a location just blocks away.





However, most residents welcomed the idea of a Safeway for its convenience and low prices. At the time Old Goucher did not have a fullservice supermarket, and weekly shopping trips at the small, family-owned Crown Market were too expensive for most. The Design Advisory Panel, responsible for maintaining a high standard of architecture and urban design in the city, rejected Safeway's first two



design proposals—but Safeway satisfied the Panel after presenting the design incorporating elements from the showroom, and obtained approval to build soon after. Buildings in the way, including the showroom, were demolished, and the store was completed in 1997. A *Baltimore Sun* article from 1998 lauded the project as a community asset, adding, "it's ironic that many activists fought the store, fearing it would bring new problems."

When Safeway was awarded the building contract, some criticized this piecemeal approach to historical preservation as lazy. The architectural historian Phoebe Stanton argued that "if you want to preserve the building, preserve the building. I don't approve of this business of breaking dishes up and saving three little chips." However, decades removed from this heated debate, it is clear that historical preservation—even on the smallest scale—provides us a window to the past.
