Car Show Rules

- <u>Rain Date</u>: There is no rain date for this show. If inclement weather causes a cancellation, an email will be sent to all preregistered attendees (email address required on registration form) and region members. In addition, an announcement will be posted on the club's website. Rules of participation will be subject to any COVID-related restrictions by the county or dealership, if any, in effect on show date.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) each vehicle's placement in the show field. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars. Registrants will be able to judge vehicles in all classes, including their own. 1st and 2nd awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class depending upon the number of vehicles registered in each class.
- **Food and Drink:** A food vendor will be on-site. All participants and guests are responsible for their own food and beverages.
- **Chairs:** All participants and guests are responsible for bringing their own chairs.

BOB HOPE AND THE GOVERNOR, STAR POWER IN A '53 ELDORADO BY LARRY GOOD

Back in 2013 on the CLC Forum, Yann Saunders posted the following picture and asked if anyone knew the occupants of the '53 Eldorado. "How about these guys? The one on the left looks like Bob Hope. What was the occasion?"

Jeff Maltby asked, "Was that Johnny Carson at the wheel?"

Tim Coy added, "Looks like Rodney Dangerfield riding shotgun! No respect at all!"

Astute speculations! I agree with all of them. Although we can't positively identify the front seat, Bob Hope's friends would naturally have been stand-up comedians. If anyone reading this knows something more, send it in.

Yann's other question, however, went unanswered. Name the occasion! Furthermore, I would ask,

- 1. In what city was this parade?
- 2. Who is the 4th person sitting next to Bob Hope on the parade boot?
- 3. What is the body number of this Eldorado?

I sent the picture to a few Club members, hoping someone would recognize the situation but received no immediate response. It was my own wife, Maia, who first brought us closer. She did a Google search and found that the Lewis Jewelry store and that branch of Cole's Shoes were next to each other in Cleveland, OH, the city where Bob grew up. Then CLC member Tom Hall, who also used to live in Cleveland, confirmed the parade route as going east on Euclid Avenue. So, Hope was a hometown boy who made good and rode a chariot through the streets in glory. Thank you, Maia! Thank you, Tom!

Did you know that Bob Hope was an immigrant, born in London? We revere him as a great American showman, but he came to the US as just a tot. Growing up in Cleveland was rough for him. As a juvenile, he did time in an Ohio reform school called the Boys' Industrial School. He was truly glad that the institution straightened him out, and later when he could afford it, he gave huge donations to BIS

A side note: In the same CLC Forum thread, Quentin Hall from Australia posted a picture of the "Perth Rat Pack" in Eldorado #87 (see below).



Defying gravity in the Southern Hemisphere, four `53 Eldorado owners packed into the **My One** & **Only** movie car (``Zelly"), #87.

Brad Pitt, riding shotgun,

posed as Quentin Hall. (Or was it the other way around?). So, I joked that Bob Hope's Eldorado gang was the "Cleveland Rat Pack." But who was the 4th guy sitting on top of the car next to Bob Hope in the Cleveland photo?







That face belongs to Frank Lausche, the Governor of Ohio at the time. The wooden scepter he holds hints that he was the parade's grand marshal. Before serving five terms as governor, Lausche was Mayor of Cleveland, and afterwards a US Senator. A semi-pro player in his youth, he was on the US Army baseball team, which kept him safe from combat in WWI. As a politician, he had a reputation for integrity. Lausche liked to reach across the aisle. He was so bipartisan that people called him "Democrat with a small d." President Eisenhower even considered him as a running mate in 1952. Lausche built an integrated political base in the days when ethnic integration was difficult, even dangerous in places.

Getting back to the parade, I still had to figure out which one it was. In 1953, Ohio celebrated 150 years of statehood. On October 20, Bob Hope and Governor Lausche both converged on Cleveland to highlight the sesquicentennial with star power. The Governor was a guest on the Bob Hope Show that evening, broadcast live from Cleveland at 8:00 PM. The parade in the photo may have been for public relations to precede the TV show. The way the spectators were dressed, it was chilly but not freezing, so October fits. My brother remarked that if the driver didn't start watching the road, he might lead the whole parade into Lake Erie. (The parade would have to move in reverse for that to happen.)

All that remains now is the biggest question for the registry:

What was the Eldorado's body number?

With black & white photos it's hard to tell, but the shades of gray here point to an Azure Blue car with blue trim. According to the <u>New Cadillac Database's 1953 Eldorado Survivor Registry</u>, those colors match 108 Eldorados in 1953 from #6 to #483. (By October 20, all 532 Eldorados had been invoiced and shipped for the model year.) The Cleveland distributor, Central Cadillac, could possibly have featured the car in the parade just as Capitol Cadillac in Washington, D.C. showed off Eldorado #2 for General Motors in Eisenhower's parade. When you think about it, parading a governor and a Hollywood A-lister in an Eldorado isn't a whole lot less than getting a president into one for his inauguration. It would have been especially nice if a film clip of the parade were aired on the national TV show, but I can't find a recording of the show to know.

All this beating around the bush still hasn't revealed the Eldorado's body number. Can any Ohio CLC members identify the car in the event from local records?

There may be a solution. My son, Paul, once restored photographs professionally, a type of magic. He tells the story of a customer who brought in a photo of a horse standing in front of a man. The customer asked, "Can you please remove the horse from the picture? This is the only photograph I have of my grandfather, and I want to see his face." So, I explained to Paul how the hood of the Eldorado is blocking the view of the body tag in the picture. In a future issue of the **Caddie Chronicle**, look for a picture of the body tag.





SINKHOLE SWALLOWS CADILLAC IN UPPER MARLBORO BY NBC/WRC4 PHOTOS BY NBC/WRC4 AND WSSC AUGUST 12, 2021

UPPER MARLBORO, Md. — A sinkhole swallowed a Cadillac, engulfing it in water Wednesday morning in the 7600 block of South Osborne Road in Upper Marlboro, Prince George's (MD) County. The driver was taken to a hospital with minor injuries, Prince George's County's fire and EMS officials told WRC-TV.

WRC reported that Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission officials said crews began working to repair a broken 30-inch water main on South Osborne Road, off Crain Highway, at about 4:00 AM. The water main break created the large sinkhole. Crews set up cones and barriers around the hole, WSSC said.







WSSC officials said the driver of the car drove around the cones and barriers and plunged into the sinkhole. It wasn't immediately clear whether the driver had seen the barriers. WSSC tweeted around 4:40 PM that the car was removed from the sinkhole and repairs would now begin.
