




### IN MEMORIAM: WILLIAM "BILL" REDFERN BY THE REDFERN FAMILY AND VINCE TALIANO



### Car Show Rules

- <u>Rain Date</u>: There is no rain date for this show. If inclement weather causes a cancellation, an email will be sent to all preregistered attendees (email address required on registration form) and region members. In addition, an announcement will be
  posted on the club's website. Rules of participation will be subject to any COVID-related restrictions by the county or dealership,
  if any, in effect on the show date.
- <u>Safety</u>: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2)
  placement in the show field. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars, including their own.
  Awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class. Trailer parking is available.
- Food and Drink: A food vendor will be on-site. All participants and guests are responsible for their own food and beverages.
- **<u>Chairs</u>** All participants and guests are responsible for bringing their own chairs.

### THE WELL-TRAVELED BURNT ORANGE CADILLAC BY MAX OLSON ESPN STAFF WRITER PHOTOS BY MAX OLSON, THE DAILY TEXAN AND SCOTT WILSON UPDATED FEBRUARY 2022

AUSTIN, Texas -- Walk the tailgating scene outside Texas' Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium and you're bound to spot a few imitators with horns on their hoods. To find the real deal, go a few extra blocks south of the stadium and meet the superfan in the parking garage. The burnt orange (officially known as Mandarin Orange Poly) and white 1975 Cadillac Sedan Deville is by now about as famous as owner Scott Wilson's streak of supporting the Longhorns.



"I've gone to virtually everything I can for the last 30 to 35 years," Wilson said.

And the Caddy has joined him for most of the fun. The one he's driving today is, in fact, the second edition. It's just as tricked out as its predecessor, with its signature mounted horns, orange upholstery and an air horn that blares "The Eyes of Texas."

Both Cadillacs were lucky finds. The first one, discovered in 1991 by a buddy who ran a towing service, had been abandoned on the side of a road.

"He said, 'You might be able to raise some hell with it," Wilson recalled. "I said, OK, let's give it a whirl."

Wilson put 50,000 miles on that burnt orange ride, traveling around to a total of 24 states to attend Texas sporting events. Their run together lasted until 2002, when Wilson was traveling back from watching the Horns win the College World Series in Omaha.





The engine blew 20 miles south of the Kansas border. They were stuck in Oklahoma. His sister, Nancy, suggested he leave the car behind. Unacceptable, he said.

"Sissy, you can't get a Christian burial in Oklahoma."

So, he got a tow, repaired the engine and put the OG Caddy in semi-retirement. Years later, another friend called with tempting news: "You won't believe what I found on eBay."

"And it was the same car," Wilson said. "It was like looking at a ghost."



Scott Wilson's 1975 burnt orange Cadillac Sedan Deville has mounted horns, orange plaid upholstery and an air horn that blares "The Eyes of Texas." It's the same year, same model, same paint job and same interior as the first one. Only had 35,000 miles on it, too. Wilson flew to Philadelphia to check it out and couldn't resist.

"I made them a deal: I'll give six grand if you throw in the 8-track tapes," Wilson said. The Cadillac had been in its previous owner's family for three generations, he said, and the son who sold it started to tear up after the deal was done.





"Simon, it's gonna have a good home," Wilson reassured him. "But, in all honesty, it's fixin' to get a new hood ornament, too."

He keeps a spare pair of horns in the back and a few bottles of vodka in the trunk. TEXAS is printed backwards on the front of the hood. Why? So drivers can see it spelled out in their rearview mirror.



"When we're coming up on someone on the Kansas turnpike, they'll know who they're dealing with," Wilson said.

The 70-year-old attorney, an Austin native and UT grad, has been a devoted attendee since 1977. He still has his football seats at the southwest goal line, 39 rows up. He's still finding time to go to swim meets and tennis tournaments, even during and after the pandemic. What keeps Wilson going after all these years is the camaraderie. He has witnessed championships and seen heartbreaking losses. You can't go to that many sporting events without figuring out how to cope.

"I don't go into mourning when we lose, cause we're gonna lose sometimes," Wilson said. "Exalt in the good times, and then just say shut up and deal on the rest of it."

And no matter what, keep going. Wilson has no end date in mind for all his travels. He'll simply keep going until he can't. "I said a long time ago you never retire from love, so I can't retire," Wilson said.





### KNOXVILLE'S FIRST CADILLAC STILL SHINES 120 YEARS LATER <u>POSITIVELY TENNESSEE</u> BY LORI TUCKER ABC5 WATE UPDATED JANUARY 23, 2022

KNOXVILLE, Tennessee -- Cadillac has long been a symbol of style, sophistication, and success for more than 100 years. Imagine being the first to own one in Knoxville.



The ruby red paint still shines. The tires still have tread.

"There's actually still oil in the engine," said Rebecca P'Simer, curator of collections at the East Tennessee Historical Society and Museum in downtown Knoxville.








The original horsehair seats show their true age. The brass headlights were fueled by kerosene, reminding us this automotive artifact is 120 years old.

"This is a 1902 Cadillac Model A," P'Simer said. "It was one of the first models that Cadillac actually came out with."



It was ordered straight from Detroit in 1902 by Knoxville dentist Reuben N. Kesterson (pictured left).

"They shipped it to Cincinnati on the railroad, he picked it up and (he) and his son drove it through East Tennessee, just kind of showing it off," P'Simer explained.

The Museum takes great care of this star attraction, a highlight of its East Tennessee tourism exhibit. Cars like this have sold at auction for well more than six figures; a far cry from the cost of a brand-new Cadillac back in the day.

"It was about \$750 for the 2-seater, \$850 for the 4-seater which is this one," P'Simer said. "Today that would be a little more than \$21,000. So, a chunk of change back then!"

Kesterson's dentist office was in the East Tennessee National Bank Building on Gay Street. He was believed to be the first college-educated dentist in the city and got a lot of attention for being the first to own one of the first Cadillacs ever made. He got to enjoy it for several years before his death in 1931.

1965 CADILLAC COUPE DEVILLE BY ADRIAN IN MALTA <u>ROCKAUTO NEWSLETTER</u> JANUARY 6, 2022



Here is my 1965 Cadillac Coupe DeVille. I am 26 years old and live on the Maltese island of Gozo. It is a tiny island but the classic car scene here is unbelievable. I have always yearned to buy a classic American "land yacht." They have always fascinated me; with their great presence and comfort which only an American car can offer. I saw a 1965 Cadillac at a local car show and immediately wanted one. I started searching online and found this gorgeous car in Texas. A rustfree, Crimson Firemist Red with Sandalwood (Beige) interior and twin spoke steering wheel (apparently a rare option) – only 41,000 original miles! It even has the original sticker on the rear bumper from the dealership in South Carolina where it was purchased in 1965.



I wanted to fly to Texas myself to look at this car before buying it, but due to COVID it was not possible. But I decided to risk it and buy the car sight unseen. The journey from the U.S. to Malta took about eight weeks. During that time, I learned of RockAuto from other enthusiasts online. I ordered basic service/tune up parts (spark plugs, engine gaskets, carb rebuild kit, etc.) which I wanted handy the moment the car arrived.




