



The museum is open for self-guided tours on Saturday and Sunday. Visitors are welcome to stroll the grounds, admire fellow CLC members' cars, and walk around the Mustang show field. After the tours, we will travel as a group to one or two local, highly recommended restaurants for dinner. We will arrange for separate checks for each party in the group(s). Out-of-towners may reserve a hotel room for the night at one of several hotels close to the museum.





# CADILLAC NOVELS AND MOVIES BY STEPHEN CLARK

Since I purchased my 1972 Cadillac Eldorado in October 2021, I have now amassed 90 books about Cadillacs, Tuckers, and other automobiles. Here is another review of six of the better Cadillac-themed novels plus four Cadillac-themed movies.




**Death in a Pink Cadillac: The Door County Special** by Kathy Buchen. Humorous mystery about two crime fighter sleuth women who crash a Supreme Cosmetics workshop owned by Fantastic Fran. When Fran ends up dead in her pink Cadillac, the plot thickens, and suspects abound. Fast moving and action-packed adventures involving lighthouse settings. Each chapter ends with a recipe. This author has eight novels in the Rhiannon Nolan mystery series. 262 pages, takes place in Wisconsin and Michigan. \*\*\*\*\*



**Buy the Chief a Cadillac** by Rick Steber. Winner of the 2005 Spur Award. Portrayal of ignorance, greed, and madness of reservation life during the disastrous 1961 termination of the Klamath Indian tribe. Chief uses his payout to buy a new convertible Cadillac and booze. 318 pages, takes place in Oregon (this book is close to home for me, as I lived in Klamath County, OR). \*\*\*\*\*



<u>Pink Cadillac</u> by Robert Dunn. Musical novel about the record "Pink Cadillac," an early rock'n'roll song by Daisy Holliday, a singer blessed by Elvis Presley. Attempts are made to try to recover the original recording. A pink Cadillac Eldorado convertible owned by Elvis is given to Daisy, and the car has a large role in the story. 391 pages, takes place in Memphis, TN. \*\*\*\*\*




<u>Duncan Delaney and the Cadillac of Doom</u> by A.L. Haskett. Chronicles an upand-coming Native American artist (Duncan Delaney) and his adventures, as he leaves his tribal family and ventures to California to try to sell his black velvet paintings of Cowboys and Indians. His journey results in felonies, good girls and bad girls, and of course, a Cadillac. 180 pages, takes place mostly in California.

**The Burial Brothers** by Simon Mayle. Author buys a 1973 Cadillac hearse in New York, and he and his buddy, Lenny, set off to travel through Latin America to party at Carnaval in Rio de Janeiro. They survive corrupt border guards, narcogangsters, a whorehouse, and multiple breakdowns. Unbelievable but adventurous. Surprise ending. 200 pages, takes place from New York to Rio de Janeiro. \*\*\*\*



<u>Candy Cadillac</u> by Claire Applewhite. Mystery novel. When Barbara Lacey is murdered, it becomes a case of mistaken identity or deception. The Grapevine Detective Agency gets involved along with a few Cadillacs and secretive black automobiles. Multiple murders occur and the tale gets more complicated. One of several books in the 'Nam Noir Series. 219 pages, takes place in Saint Louis, MO.

**To Wong Foo, Thanks for Everything! Julie Newmar**. My all-time favorite. Fantabulous adventure of three "girls" played by Patrick Swayze, Wesley Snipes and John Leguizamo. En route from New York to Hollywood to attend a drag queen beauty contest, they are forced to take a detour in their used 1967 yellow Cadillac Deville Convertible to a Midwestern town called Snydersville for car repairs. They try to make the best of the circumstances, and what results is hilarious laughs and situations. Robin Williams has a small role.



**Pink Cadillac**. Skip tracer Tommy Nowak (Clint Eastwood) takes on the job of finding Lou Ann McGuinn (Bernadette Peters) because she skipped bail. He finds her in Reno, NV and a quarter million in the trunk of a stolen 1959 pink Cadillac Series 62 convertible. Adventurous, with lots of Cadillac scenes. Unfortunately, the pristine Cadillac does not always remain that way.



**Black Cadillac**. Based on a true story. Fast paced adventure and chase scenes, starring Randy Quaid. Three young guys face the ultimate fate of survival when their car breaks down on a frozen and deserted mountain road. Joined by a local deputy sheriff, they are soon stalked by probing headlights of a 1950s vintage black Cadillac. Intense roadside chases! Again, the pristine Cadillac does not remain that way.








<u>Cadillac Man</u>. Fast-paced hilarious comedy. Opening scene shows Joey O'Brien (Robin Williams), a luxury-car salesman who drives a beautiful black Cadillac Allanté, pulling up to a funeral procession stopped because of a broken-down Cadillac hearse. Unable to help himself, he hands out business cards to the hearse driver, and widow. Main plot revolves around Larry (Tim Robbins) who crashes his motorcycle into the dealership while carrying a machine gun because he suspects his wife Donna (Annabella Sciorra) is cheating on him. What follows is a hostage situation with Joey in the middle of it. Fran Drescher plays a small role.


People loved the truck and the old cars. The displays for the show included a bus, firetruck, snowplow, a trash truck (which was spotless), and of course trolleys.
