### IN MEMORIAM: WILLIAM "BILL" KOST BY NORALEE FRANKEL AND VINCE TALIANO



It is with a heavy heart that we report that longtime CLC Potomac Region member William "Bill" Kost of Springfield, VA passed away on July 17, 2022, at the age of 80. Born five days after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor in 1941, Bill grew up on his parents' farm in Vermont, IL (population 570 -- 2020 US Census). Later, he worked for the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) for over 30 years. His work on Cuban agriculture and his support for Cuban agricultural economists helped build bridges between our two counties. He was an intellectually curious man with many interests.

Bill was a prolific collector of automobile literature and models, and along with his wife, Noralee Frankel, a major donor to the Potomac Region's annual automobilia auctions. If members purchased Cadillac literature from the 1960s-70s at our Capitol Cadillac and Sport Cadillac car shows, chances are they were donations from his collection. He was a kind and generous man who cherished his membership in the club.

One of Bill's favorite activities was cooking. He was known for his biscuits, which he lovingly made for anyone who came over to spend time with him and Noralee. He also made jewelry for Noralee, leaving a part of himself with her.

Bill also collected stamps, political cartoons and animation cells. He donated countless political cartoons and animation art to the Library of Congress and to the Billy Ireland Cartoon Museum.

Bill and Noralee's cat now hisses at everyone who sits in his favorite kitchen chair. Noralee is also sentimental about that chair where Bill spent hours reading **The Washington Post**, working on his beloved stamp collection, and sipping tea while talking with her.

He is survived by Noralee and their daughter, Elizabeth Kost, DVM, and son-in-law, Sean Van Damme. Bill's legacy is imparting his interest in math and science and love of animals to Elizabeth.




65 YEARS AGO BY VINCE TALIANO

The infamous raid of Mafia leaders gathered for a sit-down meeting in Apalachin, NY occurred in 1957, 65 years ago this month.

At some point, a photo of vehicles parked at an August 1994 Potomac Region picnic hosted at Nick Wilson's home was misidentified as a photo from the raid (see below right). It was posted on the copyright-free Wikimedia Commons and Wikipedia sites, where 75+ websites and the Smithsonian Magazine pulled it for use in stories and videos.

After this 'appropriation' came to our attention, we notified the Wikimedia and Smithsonian Magazine staff, who immediately removed the image. Other sites kept it. In one case, the National Crime Syndicate website had already included the image in a YouTube video they created titled <a href="What Happened at The Apalachin Meeting in 1957">What Happened at The Apalachin Meeting in 1957</a>? It's still there at the 3:03-3:05 minute mark.








### CADILLAC NOVELS BY STEPHEN CLARK


Since October 2021, I have now amassed over 130 books about Cadillacs, VWs and 1950-1970 automobiles. Here is another review of the better novels and movies I have seen.



**The Hearse You Came In On** by Tim Cockey. Fast-paced action murder mystery. One of the author's five books. The main character is Hitchcock Sewell, an undertaker who seems to get involved in everything, and sometimes with his Cadillac hearse. In this installment, a woman shows up at the funeral home talking about her own funeral arrangements. The mystery involves police corruption and political cover-ups. Takes place in Baltimore, MD with many local places where the action occurs, plus the title is a play on words from the famous saloon in Fells Point, **The Horse You Came In On**. 308 pages. \*\*\*\*\*




**Murder In The Hearse Degree** by Tim Cockey. Another Hitchcock Sewell excellent murder mystery where the undertaker sticks his nose where it doesn't belong. Hitch tries to prove a death is not suicide and gets involved in politics and a right-wing religious organization. Takes place in areas of Baltimore and Annapolis, MD. 324 pages. \*\*\*\*\* (FYI: I am currently reading the fifth book by Tim Cockey titled **Backstabber**. Stay tuned for my review).




**The Girl in the Red Cadillac** by Vernon L. Lichliter. Adventurous and historic story that takes place between 1907-19. About the life of twin sisters, one who leaves home and marries an older gentleman who buys her a new 1912 Cadillac (the first year with a self-starter). She becomes a female race car driver and creates lots of excitement. Takes place in Virginia and Ohio. 278 pages. \*\*\*\*\*









**Orville's Divine Cadillac and Used Car Emporium** by A.R. Marsh. Set of 22 character-driven short stories. Orville has the obsessive need to own everybody and everything around him. Religious involvement and plenty of Cadillacs. Takes place in a small North Carolina town. 182 pages. \*\*\*\*



**Cadillac Beach** by Tim Dorsey. Very popular and hysterical paperback. Fast paced and often confusing novel intertwining a 1964 jewel heist with current (at the time 2004) tourists as first-time Florida visitors. Several connected plots go on at same time. Cadillacs are all over the place. Mostly in the Miami, FL area. 384 pages. \*\*\*\* (FYI – there are more Tim Dorsey novels, if you like his style).



**Cadillac Jukebox** by James Lee Burke. New York Times bestseller. Another very popular paperback. Adventurous story about corruption in the Louisiana bayou and is the ninth Dave Robicheaux thriller. Unfortunately, there is no Cadillac car star, but there is a Cadillac jukebox. 402 pages. \*\*\*\* (FYI – one of many novels by James Lee Burke).



**Route 66 Barn Find Road Trip** by Tom Cotter, with photography by Michael Alan Ross. Fun pictorial story about a road trip from Lake Michigan to the Pacific coast along Route 66 in a 1939 Ford Woody Wagon. 2,000 mile 15-day journey. Takes place in 2016 and is loaded with fabulous pictures of cars and people and sites along the way. 192 pages. \*\*\*\*\*
