







LETTER TO THE EDITOR

NOVEMBER 21, 2022 MEETING MINUTES BY DAN RUBY AND VINCE TALIANO

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Dan Ruby thanked everyone for attending.

SECRETARY'S REMARKS: The minutes from the previous meeting were not reviewed since they were published and distributed to all members in the November 2022 newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Bill Hilliard reported the financials from the previous meeting to the present. Total revenue for the period was \$2,205.54 and total expense was \$ 111.95, resulting in a net income of \$2,093.59.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Franklin Gage announced that the region's official 2022 roster was submitted to the national CLC. Of the 181 region members, 165 were active national members at the time of submission, resulting in a 91% compliance rate (local members must maintain their national membership). The 16 out-of-compliance members will not be able to renew with the Region for 2023 until they renew with the national CLC first.

The 2023 Membership Drive is ongoing. To date, approximately 35 members eligible to renew have not done so yet. We ask that those members please submit their dues by December 15, 2022, to ensure continued receipt of the *Caddie Chronicle* without interruption.

ACTIVITIES REPORT: The following activities were discussed:



COMING TO AMERICA BY LARRY GOOD

Most of us can't remember coming to America for the first time because birth precedes memory. Others, though, like my wife, Maia, and daughters, will never forget because it was part of their youth. In October, two seasoned car collectors, Dato Shildelashvili and Boris Khvedelidze, arrived for the first time in America from the Republic of Georgia and hit the ground running. They were my guests at two car events right away: the 2022 Rockville Antique and Classic Car Show and the CLC Potomac Region Cars-n-Coffee.









The guys got to drive all my Maryland cars. Being car nuts, they won't ever forget their first experiences in the USA. Photo galleries they sent home turned their friends green with envy.

The actual arrival in America was a nightmare, but Dato and Boris took it incredibly well. When their flight arrived, I was waiting at Dulles Airport in Virginia to pick them up. Five hours later they still hadn't emerged and couldn't send word, so I feared the worst, (e.g., immigration officials had rejected their entry and sent them back to their point of origin). U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement's (ICE) has the right to do that even if a traveler's visa is perfectly valid. I drove home, despondent, in an empty car. Then at 1:00 a.m. local time, eight hours after their flight arrival, the phone rang, and Dato asked how he could get to our house. After a 21-hour trip they had survived eight more hours in line to be interrogated by US immigration. They came out victorious and smiling! Part of the reason of their lengthy delay is that ICE conducts interviews with a translation app. After all that I was happy to drive back to Dulles and pick them up.

Back in Georgia, ever since 2012, Dato had been instrumental in the restoration of my collection. His shop, Garage Gold, did most or all the work to date on my '53 Eldorado, '51 Pontiac two-door and '51 Soviet Pobyeda.

Dato has appeared a lot in past issues of the *Caddie Chronicle*. Regarding the '53 Eldorado, one article said, "Two thousand words can't describe all the rust they repaired, so two pictures have to say it all. Garage Gold put the village of Eniseli, Georgia, on the map. The welded floor repairs are seamless and with all original contour." That's the kind of work they do.

I originally met Dato when he had a Pobyeda convertible identical to mine on display at a car show outside a hotel in Tbilisi where I had organized an international conference. He told me how he had restored the car himself. A couple years later I gave him mine to restore. It's a hit wherever it goes, sort of like driving a '55 Chevy convertible in the US, only 500 times scarcer.

Now Dato is slowly working on a 1950 Moskvich 400-420A convertible (pictured right). It is really a pre-war Opel by another name. After winning WWII, the USSR moved the entire Opel Brandenburg, Germany factory to Moscow and started producing cars from the old dies under the new Russian name. Dato also favors WWII American Jeeps in his collection. The Allies left a lot of them behind after the war.

Boris' collection includes a Soviet ZIM, a huge sedan introduced in the early `50s with a



dashboard like my '47 Cadillac, a 1960 Volga Lux GAZ-21 sedan and a 1950 BMW 340 sedan, (i.e., a BMW with a horizontal grille). Boris didn't bring any pictures, so you'll have to look them up on the internet. We met when I needed to find a plater for the Eldorado parts in Yerevan, Armenia. Boris took me all around town and helped interview the right specialists, so I could choose the best one.

In a 2020 *Caddie Chronicle*, I wrote, "Armenia is another country. Its capital Yerevan is eight hours away by truck from the Georgian capital Tbilisi with an international border in between. Fortunately, Dato knew a trucker, Boris, who is also a car collector and who delivers freight back and forth between the two cities twice a week. When the pandemic hit, Georgia closed its entire border to personnel from all countries but left one remote Armenian checkpoint open for freight. Boris is fluent in Georgian, Armenian and Russian... exactly the kind of person you want for this purpose. Guards in both countries consider him as a native and wave him through. So, Boris carries my Eldorado parts across the mountain pass between the two countries during the pandemic at a *very* affordable price."







Over the next two years Boris transported all the Eldorado's chrome and plastic to Yerevan and back. I owe him big-time, and this U.S. visit was a welcome chance to return the favor in Maryland, including an introduction to steamed crabs.

The day before the guys departed Maryland for New York, Boris told me, "I am completely satisfied with this trip to America already. If the officials throw me out and send me back home tomorrow, I would still be happy with everything we've done up to now. It was worth the trip!"

There you have it.

This is an original print UPI Telephoto, with UPI attribution markings on



It's interesting because I can't find a '52 Cadillac color that is remotely close to coral. There is a Phoenix Beige but it could never be construed as coral.

Ike spent the first 2 weeks after the election in Georgia, although his transition headquarters was in New York City where he was still President of Columbia University. So, it is unclear if he flew-in and went directly to the White House or was staying in Washington, D.C.

24TH ANNUAL ASPEN HILL SHOPPING CENTER CAR SHOW BY SANDY KEMPER

A few years ago, as I drove north on Connecticut Avenue in the Aspen Hill area of Montgomery County, MD, I glanced at the Aspen Hill Shopping Center and noticed a large number of antique and hot rod cars parked in the shopping center's lot. At the time, I couldn't stop to look at the cars, but I told myself that I'd have to check it out in the future.

On the bright and pleasant morning of Saturday, November 5, I finally made it to the Aspen Hill Car Show. There were roughly 100 plus cars on display, and they were a mix of classics, modifieds, hot rods along with a few motorcycles. Among the cars, there was only one Cadillac on display and that was "Cherryette," the marvelous 1949 Cadillac Club Coupe (pictured top right) of Randy & Susan Denchfield. They had another car at the show too: a 1962 Chevrolet Impala convertible (pictured bottom right) that closely resembles the car of Randy's teenage years. Also participating in the show was longstanding Potomac Region member Richard Sisson with his outstanding 1970 Pontiac Grand Prix SJ (pictured below).







Billed as the "Last Car Show of the Season," the Aspen Hill Car Show was a delight worth the stop.





CADILLACS FOR SALE AT HERSHEY 2022 BY SANDY KEMPER

In an article that I wrote for this newsletter in 2017, I suggested "if one is interested in buying a classic Cadillac, the annual AACA Eastern Fall Meet in Hershey, PA, held in early October, is the place to go." Five years later, this statement is still valid. The automobile sales parking area, otherwise known as the Car Corral, is situated along the lengthy access road that surrounds the Giant Center, a large civic arena. There are hundreds of cars for sale and among them are many Cadillacs. Although it's obvious to those of us who traverse the Car Corral year after year that the number of cars for sale overall has diminished in the two most recent years, Cadillacs were still plentiful. Here's a small sampling of the "Cadillacs for Sale at Hershey 2022."







[Upper left] This 1956, Series 62 convertible with 58,000 miles was listed for \$49,000. By contrast, the 1956 hardtop [lower left], which appeared to be a Series 62 also, had 41,000 miles and was listed for \$100,000. Which would you choose?

Want a more modern car? The 1992 Fleetwood four-door sedan [above] with 60,000 miles was being offered at \$21,000.





Besides the cars in the Car Corral and scattered among the Flea Market fields, there is another venue nearby in Hershey with many Cadillacs for sale. This year was the sixteenth year that RM/Sotheby's Auctions has held a sale at the Hershey Fall Meet. The auction was conducted over two days at the historic Hershey Lodge but prior to the start times, the nearly 125 cars to be auctioned were all staged under two huge tents erected in the parking lots of the Hershey Lodge. Cadillacs represented over ten percent of the cars auctioned and one of them was the auction's top seller at \$880,000: a 1930 Cadillac V-16 Sport Phaeton.

[Pictured right] Here's the top dollar winner mentioned above. One of 17 survivors of the 85 V-16 Sport Phaetons built. It has had a notable ownership history.


Equally rare (one of three built in 1929), but apparently not as desirable as the Sport Phaeton, the 1929 V-8 Transformable Town Cabriolet [both photos below] did not sell. The estimated price range was listed as \$90,000-120,000.















The 1905 Model E Runabout [above left] was a terrific concours quality example of the Cadillac two-seater, one-cylinder engine, cars of the Brass Era. It sold for \$72,600. Another Brass Era car, the 1910 Model 30 Roadster (above right) was billed as having its "original interior upholstery" and an "exceptionally nice patina." Perhaps not a concours quality car, but perfect for vintage car touring. It sold for \$49,500.

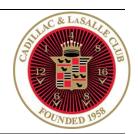




The exceptionally striking two-tone blue 1927 Cadillac 314 Imperial Seven-Passenger Sedan [above left] sold for \$41,800. The triple black color scheme was a feature of the 1941 Cadillac Series 62 Convertible [above right] which sold for \$55,000.

There are many places from which one can buy a vintage Cadillac, including the splendid offerings in this newsletter. But the AACA Fall Meet in Hershey every October provides a remarkable amount of Cadillacs for sale. See you next year!
