

- Take I-495 N / Capital Beltway N
- Keep left to get onto I-270 N / Dwight D Eisenhower Hwy N
- At Exit 9A-B, head right on the ramp for I-370 toward Metro Station
- Keep straight to get onto MD-200 E / Intercounty Connector E
- At Exit 17, head right on the ramp toward Briggs Chaney Rd.

Car Show Rules

- Rain Date: Sunday, May 21, 2023, is the rain date for this show. If inclement weather causes a postponement or cancellation, an email will be sent to all pre-registered attendees (email address required on registration form) and Potomac Region members. In addition, an announcement will be posted on the club's website. Rules of participation will be subject to any COVID-related restrictions by the county or dealership, if any, in effect on the show date.
- Safety: If a vehicle has fluid drips or leaks, the owner must bring absorbent material or drip pans to avoid slippery conditions and to protect the show field parking lot. The Potomac Region reserves the right to prevent any cars with excessive fluid leaks from entering the show field. It is recommended that a working fire extinguisher be in every vehicle.
- Judging / Parking Rules: The Potomac Region reserves the right 1) to determine each vehicle's judging class and 2) placement in the show field. Vehicles will be peer judged by the individual owners of the registered cars, including their own. Awards will be given to winning vehicles in each class. Trailer parking is available.
- Food and Drink: A food vendor will be on-site. All participants and quests are responsible for their own food and beverages.
- **Chairs:** All participants and guests are responsible for bringing their own chairs.






1973 CADILLAC ELDORADO BY DAKOTA IN MISSOURI ROCKAUTO NEWSLETTER FEBRUARY 2023

THE CADILLAC FROM ONCE UPON A TIME IN...HOLLYWOOD BY RAPH TRIPP

1969 was one helluva year, what with the Apollo 11 moon landing, the Beatles' Abbey Road, Woodstock, Altamont, Easy Rider, Vietnam, and of course the frightening Manson murders. Quentin Tarantino's movie *Once Upon a Time in Hollywood* is not only an ode to old Hollywood, but also to the City of Angels itself, circa 1969. LA was, and remains, a city dominated by the car. When you set a movie in 1969 Los Angeles, you better have the cars to back it up, and *Once Upon a Time in Hollywood* does that in spades.

Steven Butcher was the film's Picture Car Coordinator, which sounds like a dream job for any lover of 1960s American cars. Butcher has stated that some 2,000 vintage cars were sourced for the film, from those driven by the actors, to the cars parked in restaurant car parks, movie set back lots and being driven on LA's iconic boulevards. The average film uses between 300-500 cars, highlighting just how much location shooting Tarantino's script demanded.

Let's look at the details of the main car, a 1966 Cadillac Coupe Deville, featured in **Once Upon a Time in Hollywood**.

Wealthy Americans of the 1960s generally traded their cars for the latest model every two to three years, so we have to assume Rick Dalton would soon trade his '66 Caddie for a new model. In reality, Tarantino insisted on using this particular Coupe Deville as it was also featured in his breakthrough 1992 hit - **Reservoir Dogs**. In that movie the car is driven by



actor Michael Madsen's character Mr. Blonde (pictured above). The car itself belongs to Madsen, who has a cameo in **Once Upon a Time in Hollywood**, playing Sheriff Hackett in a clip from Dalton's (fictional) western TV show **Bounty Law**.

Owned by actor Rick Dalton (Leonardo DiCaprio), the 1966 Cadillac Coupe Deville is driven exclusively by his stuntman Cliff Booth (Brad Pitt). Having lost his license for DUI Dalton is chauffeured around by his stunt double; a good portion of the film follows the Cadillac as Booth does the rounds.

Tarantino initially wanted Dalton to drive a '59 Cadillac convertible, which would've blown the budget and as Butcher pointed out to the director, no Hollywood actor would've driven a ten-year-old Caddie in 1969. Tarantino compromised by including a flashback narrated by Cliff Booth showing Dalton's previous car, which was a '59 Cadillac convertible like the one pictured below.

Dalton's '66 Coupe Deville is a buttery yellow called Cape Ivory. Redesigned for 1965, the Deville series rode on an enormous 129.5-inch (3289mm) wheelbase. Tailfins from the rounded look 1964 model gave way to the distinct body lines of the new model. Also new were vertical lamp clusters and headlight pairs changed from horizontal to vertical permitting a wider grille. Power was supplied by the potent 340 horsepower 429 C.I. (7-liter) V8 engine.

For 1966 Cadillac changed the grille subtly from the '65 model and there was generally less chrome on all Cadillacs, heralding a move away from the Detroit's long held obsession with chromium. Firsts included variable ratio power steering and optional front seats with carbon cloth heating pads built into the cushions. Comfort and convenience innovations included headrests, reclining seats, and an AM/FM stereo. All in all, a '66 Coupe Deville was a very comfortable way to get around late 1960s Los Angeles.

STAMP MODELS SURPRISE: TANK-LIKE CADILLAC BY JEFF GURSKI ORIGINALLY PUBLISHED IN THE SEPTEMBER 2022 ISSUE OF THE CAPITOL MINATURE AUTO COLLECTORS CLUB NEWSLETTER

In 2022, new STAMP model releases proved a sudden embarrassment of model riches for this old Caddy fan. I think they must have found the secret access panel to my daydreams about the Cadillacs I remember in my life that I always secretly wanted to see replicated in scale.

One was this beautiful STAMP replica of a black 1964 Cadillac Sixty Special. It reminds me of an incident during my freshman year at Fort Hunt High School in Alexandria, VA in 1964 with just such a real car. My fellow freshman and I were



too young to have driver's licenses yet, and the high school football "away games" thing was a whole new experience for all of us. Since we couldn't yet drive ourselves across town, our parents were generally good sports about it, and families would meet at the Fort Hunt parking lot and divide up to go in parent volunteers' cars. It was a nice arrangement, and generally the opposing high schools weren't all that distant a drive.




Since most of the Fort Hunt students had gone through elementary and middle school together, we all knew each other well enough and often all the parents too. It didn't take long to pair off with old buddies and be on the road with balloons and streamers. My friend Julia's mom had a big new shiny black 1964 Cadillac Sixty Special that anyone with a brain could see was a


beautiful and very special car. We piled into the Caddy like there was no tomorrow, trying to remember our manners.

When the game was over at nearby George Washington High, we gathered our crew and piled back in the Caddy for the happy and noisy ride home. However, disaster struck. We didn't get a block away when another car rammed us from behind! The noise was frightening as metal, glass, and liquid, spilled outside onto the street. Fortunately, nobody in the Caddy was hurt. A policeman had all of us get out of the Cadillac to check for injuries. The car that hit us from behind was a new 1964 Ford that had caved its grill, punctured its radiator, bent its hood, and broken out all its headlights. The Ford's antifreeze was running down into the gutter. But Julia's mom's big, beautiful Cadillac Sixty Special that had been so rudely violated had only one cracked taillight -- that was its only damage! I knew at my tender age of fourteen that one day I would have to own a tough car like that big Cadillac one day, and I never forgot that tank-like car.






70 YEARS AGO: ANOTHER CADILLAC EVENT BY VINCE TALIANO



In January 1953, two significant Cadillac events occurred. One was featured in the <u>January issue</u> of the <u>Caddie Chronicle</u>: President Eisenhower being transported in the Inauguration Parade in Eldorado #2 on January 20. The other occurred on January 1: the death of Country Music Superstar Hank Williams. According to Wikipedia, "On New Year's Day 1953, at the age of 29, Williams suffered from heart failure while being driven to his next scheduled concert in Charleston, WV, and died suddenly in the back seat of his Olympic Blue 1952 Cadillac Series 62 Convertible in Oak Hill, WV."

In 2014, Travis Kitchens contacted the Potomac Region looking for a 1952 Cadillac convertible to be used in a video production of Country Singer Arty Hill's song titled *Is There Something You Can Do? (New Year's 1953)*. It is told from the perspective of Charles Carr, Hank's driver who discovered him dead in the back seat. The song starts with the following introduction:

There was an all night service station in Oak Hill. One man came out. I asked him to take a look at Hank and tell me what he thought. He said, "He's dead." I said, "There's nothing you can do for him"? He said, "No, he's just dead."





Not having a 1952 Series 62 Convertible in the area, Dan Ruby offered his 1953 Coupe Deville (pictured above left). Travis accepted and cleverly filmed the car in angles that minimized showing it as a hardtop coupe. While the song played, driving scenes and close ups of the interior were mixed in with historic pictures of Hank Williams (see photo above right with his silhouette). Watch the great video! In 2022, the British Heavy Metal band *Judas Priest* was inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. Through the 1970s, they recorded several albums but did not experience widespread success in the U.S. In 1980, their album *British Steel* was released and featured a song titled *Breaking the Law*. Its iconic guitar riff, stellar beat, and solid lyrics were just what the band needed to elevate their status in the States.





To showcase the song, a music video was directed by Julien Temple. It showed singer Rob Halford being driven in the back of a 1974 Eldorado Convertible (pictured above). The driver pulled over at a bank, where Rob jumped out of the car, entered the building, broke into the vault with his bandmates K. K. Downing (guitar), Glenn Tipton (guitar), Ian Hill (bass) and Dave Holland (drums), and stole a gold record for the album *British Steel*.

Then, the band exited the bank, jumped into the Eldorado getaway car, and took off. The video ended with them playing the song in the convertible. Some may say their journey to musical immortality began in the back of this Eldorado because MTV (Music Television) was launched in the U.S. soon after the video was made, and it was played repeatedly. It gave the band the exposure they deserved for this classic song. Watch the great video!

What started as a joke became a reality!

When I was growing up my grandparents always took me to this specific steakhouse every Sunday. All their friends would be there and basically, they would all hang out for the evening. One of my grandpa's closest friends owned two 1965 Cadillacs. There was an ongoing joke that when I turned sixteen, I would get one of the Cadillacs.



Both Cadillacs were the same year and model, but the only difference was color: one was red, and one was silver. Both were Arizona cars originally, and the interior and the paint had been redone. Everything else was completely original (even the engines – 429/345hp V8s). The cars were from a town called Jerome in Arizona, and they were kept at the famous <u>Jerome Grand Hotel</u>. The hotel is a hotspot for people in the paranormal world, as it's supposedly super haunted, and has even been on an episode of the TV show *Ghost Adventures*.





The cars were then bought by my grandparents' friend and moved to Nebraska in 2007. In 2019, their friend decided to downsize and put the cars up for auction. On the way to the auction site, the red Cadillac decided to blow an engine. The silver one went across the block, and it ended up in Des Moines, IA. The red one he kept to fix up, then realized something. My sixteenth birthday was coming up. So, he called my grandpa, and my grandpa bought the car from him to give to me.




I was now a teenager who had a twenty-one-foot first car that took up two spots in the process of parking. It was kept about forty minutes west of Omaha, NE, so when I took it to Elkhorn, a suburb of Omaha, I realized it was the only car like it in the city. I had the only classic Cadillac here. It soon became an instant hit at the local car shows. A little over a year later it won a first place at one car show and came in third in its class at another one.

Since I've had the car, it's been on a calendar, on the local news and even been featured on 1320video.com twice. Last time I checked it had over 5,000 views. To document its adventures, I made an Instagram account for it (you can follow here). The account has



over 300 followers, and two of the biggest Cadillac clubs in the world (the Cadillac & LaSalle Club and the Cadillac Kings) follow it. We also have followers as far away as France and Germany. I'm ecstatic to see how far it's come and surprised by how popular it is.

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



