The Best of Show and other special awards were presented last and did not disappoint. Best of Show – Early (1970 or earlier) went to Rich Taylor of Philadelphia, PA for his 1947 Series 75 Limousine and Best of Show – Late (1971 or later) was awarded to original owner Maurice Jones of Washington, DC for his 1976 Fleetwood Brougham d'Elegance. For this show, a Best Professional Award was added and given to Bill Gibson's 1967 Miller Meteor Combination Ambulance / Hearse from Burtonsville, MD. He could have also won the 'Short Distance Award,' if there was one, for travelling from the neighboring town. Dan Ruby selected Don Pace's 1992 Brougham from Upper Marlboro, MD for the Henry Ruby Memorial Award, honoring Dan's late father and former Potomac Region Car Show Coordinator, and Maia Good presented the Ladies' Choice Award to Dan Murray 1957 Eldorado Biarritz from Washington, DC. When it came time to announce the Dealer's Choice Award, Daniel Jobe, former owner of Capitol Cadillac and sponsor of Potomac Region shows for 30 years, filled in for Gibbs Fogarty, who had to leave early. It was given to Patrick Flaherty of Edgewater, MD for his 1960 Coupe Deville. The last award was for Long Distance and was 'too close to call' between Rich Taylor's 1947 Series 75 Limousine from Philadelphia, PA and Michael Stinson's 1996 Fleetwood Brougham's from Blue Bell, PA. The consensus tiebreaker, suggested by Michael, was the age of the car, which resulted in a win for Rich and his Limo. Thanks to Sport Cadillac and Rick Menz for sponsoring the awards.

50 YEARS AGO: REAL HORSEPOWER BY VINCE TALIANO

Growing up in Baltimore in the 1970s, it was hard not to have been a thoroughbred horse racing fan, especially with the Preakness Stakes taking place at Pimlico Racecourse on the third Saturday of May each year. Wikipedia describes it as "a Grade I race run over a distance of 9.5 furlongs (1 3/16 miles or 1,900 meters) on dirt. Colts and geldings carry 126 pounds (57 kilograms), fillies 121 pounds (55 kilograms). It is the second jewel of the Triple Crown, held two weeks after the Kentucky Derby and three weeks before the Belmont Stakes."

In Baltimore, Preakness day is a combination holiday and religious experience. In 1973, I was too young to attend in person, so I was home watching with my family. When the race ended, the great Secretariat and



Jockey Ron Turcotte followed up their come-from-behind victory at the Kentucky Derby with another impressive win over the field and top competitor, Sham. Then, what happened three weeks later at the Belmont made history that hasn't been matched since. They won by 31 lengths in what is regarded as one of the greatest horse races in history. Secretariat died in 1989. According to <u>The Washington Post</u> article referenced above, "about 12,000 people per year visit Claiborne Farm, and everyone agrees most do so foremost to see Secretariat's gravestone. Some cry. Some place pennies atop in honor of <u>Penny Chenery</u>, his beloved owner who died in 2017 at age 95."





THE DEFIANCE ELDORADO – PART II BY LARRY GOOD

Last July we ran an article in the *Caddie Chronicle* on the "Defiance Eldorado," an Eldorado used by President Eisenhower on October 15, 1953, that nobody seemed to be aware of. It is not the famous inauguration parade car, Cadillac Eldorado #2. This mystery Eldorado carried Ike to a college ceremony in the town of Defiance, OH, nine months after the inauguration. The body number and engine serial number (VIN) are still not known, but with the recent discovery of Matt Larson's research we are looking hard to find them.

Now a new photo of the Defiance Eldorado at the event with Eisenhower has turned up (see below).

Ms. Barbara Sedlock, Lead Librarian and Coordinator of Metadata and Archives for Defiance College, forwarded this picture that she had just received from the son of Robert D. Lindsey, who took the picture. (Eldorado fan Ross Morgan would call this a "never before photo.")

Ms. Sedlock wrote, "Today (4-12-2023) a gentleman brought in a CD of some photos his father had taken on 10-15-1953 when Ike visited Defiance College, ones I hadn't seen before. Robert D. Lindsey (was) a part-time photographer in Bryan, OH. His son brought the pictures to me. He said his dad held other jobs too, but he was in demand for wedding and graduation pictures and that kind of work. The son donated his father's other pictures to the Williams County Library, but since this set was taken on the Defiance College campus, he made copies of those for us to have."

In the picture it looks like the crowds are held back 75 yards or so, but the shot of the President by the car looks much closer. I mentioned that the photographer must have had a telephoto lens. Ms. Sedlock replied, "The donor of the pictures said his father had a regular journalist's folding camera that was common in the '50s and he said it did not have telephoto or anything on it special. He himself marveled that his father was allowed to be that close to Ike. All before the Kennedy assassination, though attempts had been made on both Roosevelts before 1953. Maybe the Secret Service figured Defiance was a low-risk area, unlike a big city?"

On the other side of the Eldorado is the parked red Lincoln that transported the Secret Service team. Surrounded by agents, the Eldorado is as well protected at this stop as the President is.

I wondered where the motorcade had stopped in the new picture. The setting does not look like either the college campus or a train station. No stop between them was included in Ike's printed agenda. Ms. Sedwick explained, "I was told that after Ike's speech, the car carried him a short distance, from where he spoke, to a railroad track that runs along the edge of campus, where there is no station. Local contractors were apparently asked to build a platform that would enable Ike to board his special train car on that track, which I think explains the little hut with '**DUERK**' on it in the background, a local building firm (pictured right). The rail line still exists and occasionally we



see slow trains coming down it. It's not used a lot; I think mostly rail cars bringing supplies to a factory near campus. Anyway, that would explain why the Ike arrival photos show a depot, but the departure ones don't."





So, Ike was carried out of Defiance from a railroad spur. We knew that he left for Toledo on the Wabash Railroad, having arrived from somewhere else on the B&O. The engineer of the new train backed it into the Wabash siding and positioned it by Ike's special platform of the day, probably even before Ike arrived in town on the B&O. It means the grandiose departure pose on the observation platform of the tail car (right) was staged on this Wabash freight siding.


There is one more intriguing picture of Ike in the "Defiance Eldorado." For years this very nice color picture below was posted by Dave Gelinas on <u>Flckr</u>, but then it disappeared. The original photographer is unknown. Efforts to reach Mr. Gelinas bring no results. As posted, it incorrectly labeled the scene as "Leipsic, OH campaign, ca. 1956." However, this is clearly the Eisenhower visit to Defiance, OH, in 1953. Both cars in this picture are the same 1953 models as in all other Defiance College photos of October 15, 1953. The license plate on the front of the Eldorado

is the same number and font. Presidents Eisenhower and McCann are in the same positions in the back seat of the Eldorado. The same Secret Service agents are in the Lincoln chase car.

October 15 seems right for Ohio with the leaves turning colors and falling. It was a mild fall day with people wearing only light jackets. Back in the trees off to the right appears what may be a Hudson from the late '40s.

With our latest information, we may assume that the route in this color picture on a very small street with a very small crowd was Ike's departure route to the railroad siding, probably unannounced. A local resident identified the street as running along the Defiance College campus boundary. It was not the grand entrance in the 40-car motorcade on main streets lined with thousands of people from the passenger station to the campus. Now we can understand why the President's Agenda called for only five minutes for the "Motorcade from Campus to Train" at the end of the visit instead of the 10 minutes scheduled for the two miles "from B & O Station to Campus" in the beginning.

What is amazing, after 70 subsequent years of violent world history, is the intimacy of this 1953 picture. Where are the barricades and crowd control? Talk about low risk! Spectators are casually standing with friends and family only eight or ten feet away from the President. They could have touched the Eldorado. And it was all real!

In 2002, the CLC Grand National was held in Dearborn, MI. It commemorated the 100th Anniversary of Cadillac. To date, it is the largest Grand National held in terms of vehicles and participants.

Valley Forge Region member Rich Taylor was on-site filming the event, as he has done with other events. Afterwards, he made copies of the two VHS tapes and provided them to members, including Potomac Region charter member Juan Aranda. When Juan was selling his home a few years ago, he donated the VHS tapes to the Region's archives. The tapes were converted to digital files.

As I was watching the footage a few months ago for the first time, it took some time to figure out who was walking around the show field filming and interviewing attendees and their cars. Once it became apparent that it was Rich, I called him to introduce myself and get his permission to post to <u>YouTube</u> for others to see this 'lost' footage. He graciously agreed and mentioned he had other videos he would be willing to share with me.









