LETTER TO THE EDITOR


June 13, 2023



CADILLAC DRIVE CADILLAC BY JASON CUNNINGHAM

Here is a picture of my 1922 Cadillac Type 61 Seven-Passenger Touring car on Cadillac Drive in Gaithersburg, MD! I have owned the car for about two years. It has an 85 horsepower, 314 cubic inch L-head V8 engine, which is only slightly updated from the V8 engine Cadillac introduced in 1914 that is considered the first production V8 ever made. These Cadillacs were popular with the U.S. Army - General Pershing used one in Mexico while chasing Pancho Villa in 1916-17 and was



impressed by its reliability. Similar V8 Cadillacs were widely used by Pershing and others as staff cars during World War I. The reliable V8 would be Cadillac's premiere power plant until the early 1930s when the cylinder wars produced the V12 and V16 engines.

Three things my wife, Debbie, and I like are: (1) touring in our old Caddy convertibles, (2) visiting the Maryland Eastern Shore and (3) eating Maryland crab cakes! The annual <u>Chesapeake Bay Motoring Festival</u> based at the Kent Island Yacht Club checked all those boxes for us! Held on Saturday and Sunday, June 10-11, this year's festival was jam packed with cars and coffee events, a driving tour, great food and a mini Concours event, all luxuriating in fabulous weather on the waterfront.

We left early Saturday for the 50-mile trip over the Chesapeake Bay Bridge in our black 1941 Cadillac Series 62 Convertible Coupe to the Kent Island Yacht Club. The trip was uneventful and traffic over the bridge was mild, so it only took us an hour to get there in time for the first cars and coffee event. Here we lined up in an eclectic procession of special interest and collector cars that included, among others, a new Rolls-Royce Phantom sedan, a Cobra CSX Coupe replica, a 1953 Chevy 3100 pick-up, a 1993 Porsche 911 Rensport, a 1937 Packard 120 sedan, a 1954 Corvette, a 1975 Chevy Caprice convertible and a 1956 Ford Crown Victoria Glass-top coupe (pictured below).



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At about 9:30 a.m., our touring group departed under police escort to the historic Cloverfields Mansion and Gardens in Queenstown, MD. Dating to 1705 and recently restored to its 1784 configuration, Cloverfields includes numerous outbuildings, including an icehouse. On the grounds are beautiful gardens and a very old cemetery plot that includes members of the original family on the estate - the Hemsley family. After



touring the grounds and soaking in the sun for about an hour, we headed back for the 12-mile drive to the Kent Island Yacht Club. There we enjoyed a delicious lunch in the clubhouse of – you guessed it – *crab cakes*!

When we returned to the yacht club, we drove onto the show grounds behind the club house for placement on the show field. Here our '41 Cadillac joined about 70 cars and a dozen or so antique boats on display. We were fortunate to be placed in a spot between an outdoor pavilion and a tiki-style bar! Drinks, shade, and rest rooms were close by! Each car was given a number for Peoples' Choice voting. We enjoyed touring the field and hanging by our car to answer questions.



As the Saturday show wound down at about 4:00 p.m., we were invited to take a cruise abord the **Maria Isabel**, a 67' motor yacht owned by Charles & Marisa Dolbey. On our 90-minute tour down Prospect Bay to Coxes Bay, among about 20 guests, we enjoyed the company of Luke Phipps, the Chairman of the Festival and the St. Michaels Concours, and our long-time friends Joe & Gail Hikel, and Gail's sister Cindy. We got back to the dock just in time for us to drive over to our local hotel, the Best Western, to shower and change clothes for dinner.





As participants in last year's St. Michaels Concours, we were invited to a special dinner hosted by Luke Phipps at the Narrows Restaurant on the waterfront of Kent Island that is owned by Luke's wife, Kelly Phipps. Here, our group enjoyed a fabulous Eastern Shore dinner of – you guessed it – *crab cakes* along with other libations and dessert. Kelly & Luke are involved in many Eastern Shore ventures and causes. At the dinner, she talked about an important group for which she volunteers and acts as Chairwoman – the <u>Queen Anne's County Mental Health</u> <u>Committee</u>, which raise funds for various mental health-related organizations and facilities – a truly worthy cause! We have enjoyed the Narrows Restaurant before and it has become our favorite "go-to" seafood venue when visiting the area.

Sunday dawned with the same splendid weather we had the day before, albeit a little warmer. We arrived on the show field and parked in the same spot we had Saturday. More cars arrived and there were some additional Cadillacs, including a 1970 Coupe DeVille, a 1960 Eldorado Biarritz convertible, the late Charles Gillet's 1931 V-16 Fleetwood Convertible Sedan now owned by Leigh Brent and a far-out, full custom 1940 Cadillac Series 62 coupe.



We moved over to make room for the '40 coupe to provide an interesting contrast – a modern full-custom air-bagged and chopped '40 Coupe next to a bone stock '41 convertible designed by Harley Earl (pictured above). The '40 had a 4 1/2" chop – in fact the top came from a similar C-body 1940 Pontiac. Much of the rear body was from a '40 Buick, and the front end was definitely a '40 Cadillac, with the beautifully chromed prow grill and bumper with horizontal guards. So, this car was the product of three (3) donor cars! The air-bag suspension enabled the car to literally hug the ground when idle. Painted in a lustrous light metallic root beer color, this well-built gem eventually won Best of Show honors.

There were several very rare Dodges in attendance. One was a 1960 Polara convertible with a 383 engine with the wild cross-ram dual carburetor set-up that was famous in early '60s MOPARs. Restored in black with a red interior, this was a showstopper and award winner. Another was a 1954 Dodge Indianapolis Pace Car replica from the factory. This yellow beauty sported a 331 CI Hemi. In contrast, next to the 1954 was a 1922 Dodge Brothers touring car.





Packard fans enjoyed a 1940 Super Eight 160 Convertible Sedan that had been in the owner's family since 1946 and was his own first car. Said to have over 400K miles on the clock, the car was beautifully restored in a factory deep charcoal color with dark burgundy hides. Also on hand was our friend Chuck McDonald's 1937 120 sedan with its recently installed overdrive transmission. I have always felt the mid-thirties Packard 120s were some of the prettiest, best proportioned cars of the classic era (I also believe the LaSalles of the same era are equally appealing!). This one didn't disappoint.

Again, the show field reflected all genres of cars – a new Rolls Phantom convertible to join the sedan, a Ferrari America convertible, several race-ready Austin Healey's, C1, C2, C3, C5, C6 and C8 Corvettes, including a new ZL1, a 1940 Buick Series 90 limo, a 1935 Ford five-window coupe, a 1968 Porsche 911S, several Jaguar XKE's, a new Mercedes AMG SL63 roadster, a 1953 Fiberglas Studebaker kit car, and, not to be missed, a late '60s Meyers Manx dune 'Shark buggy" with a great white shark replica on top and all kinds of fishing gear hanging off it – also signed by Bruce Meyers himself!



We greatly enjoyed walking around all these cars until we returned to our car to find it had been dive-bombed by some big birds! Over a dozen white blotches all over our black canvas top and running down the sides of our black car. UGHH! It took about 45 minutes to get most of it off – and I still have a lot of work to do for the rest.

Around 2:00 p.m. the judges came around to get award winning cars lined up. We were fortunate to get a blue ribbon and award as a People's Choice winner – the award was sponsored by Land Rover. As mentioned before, the custom '40 Cadillac deservedly won Best of Show, and other winners of various categories included the 1960 Dodge Polara, 2022 ZL1 Corvette, 1953 Chevy 3100 pick-up, 1962 Ford pick-up, Austin Healey 3000 race car, 1966 Chevy Nova custom, 1940 Packard 160, and the Manx Shark dune buggy.

In the 3 ½ years we've owned it; we have now put over 3,500 miles on it. To paraphrase Army slang – "drive 'em if you got 'em." We look forward to next year's Chesapeake Bay Motor Festival and hope more Cadillacs and LaSalles participate!

The Potomac Region was well-represented in Albuquerque; here are just a few of the members who were in attendance.


