

DIRECTOR'S REMARKS: Dan thanked everyone for attending. He also thanked Vince Taliano for his 20 years of service as Newsletter Editor. In addition, Dan asked everyone to keep charter member Juan Aranda, who has had recent medical issues, in their prayers and thoughts.

SECRETARY'S REMARKS: The minutes from the previous meeting were not reviewed since they were published and distributed to all members in the November 2023 newsletter.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Bill Hilliard reported on the financials since the last meeting. Total revenue was \$2,328.26 and total expense of \$206.39 for the period, resulting in a net gain of \$2,121.87. Most of the revenue was from 2024-25 membership dues.

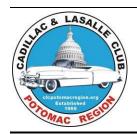

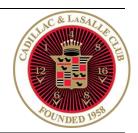

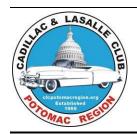

ELDORADO OF THE MONTH: #533, THE LAST OF THE FIRST BY LARRY GOOD

This past summer, my wife Maia and I started our drive to the 2023 Grand National on the Lincoln Highway, America's first cross-country roadway. When dedicated 110 years ago, it was not a limited access highway posted at 70 mph. Today, just a stone's throw north of the old Lincoln Highway in Barberton, OH is Cole's Classics, LLC, an amazing restoration shop full of '53 Cadillacs and other models. At the top of my prioritized personal list of material possessions are 1953 Eldorados, and Aaron Cole has them. Notably, Aaron and his team at Cole's Classics are actually restoring 1953 Eldorado #533. That's where the numbers stop. There are no more.

This Cadillac's 1953 manufacturing history is as follows:

Early August (est.) to August 18, 1953 (per body tag, above):

Construction of basic convertible body at Fleetwood Fisher Plant

August 18 to September 24, 1953 (calculated), including GM downtime due to a fire: Hand customization of Eldorado body at Fisher Plant 21

September 24 to October 7, 1953 (per build sheet, next page):


Assembly & inspection at Cadillac Clark Ave. Plant; shipment to distributor in Philadelphia

Being the highest sequential body number, #533 was the last Eldorado started by the Fleetwood Fisher Body Plant. Bodies normally spent a couple weeks there. This one was assigned its number some time shortly before the August 12 Hydramatic Plant fire and, we think, transferred from the Fleetwood Plant to Plant 21 on August 18. Six days after the fire, the Fleetwood Fisher Plant was still working to complete the orders already started.





In studying 1953 production, there always seems to be a missing time period with Eldorados. While it took normal Cadillacs a couple days to get through assembly, testing and inspection at Clark Ave., it seemed to take Eldorados a month, and in this case even longer with the fire delay. CLC Past President Alan Haas offered an explanation. He worked at Cadillac in the 20th century and remembered that limousines and other special bodies were crafted at Fisher Plant 21. That would explain it. Maybe someday records will turn up to prove it, but Alan was there. That's good enough to explain the time gap and conclude that Plant 21 did the custom body work on '53 Eldorados.

Finally, Eldorado #533 spent a week in assembly, inspection and testing at Clark Ave., longer than average, but not as long as some of the other post-fire 1953 Eldorados. The worst case was the last one out the door, #489, which shipped to a distributor in Vermont on October 20. There was a month from entry to exit of #489 at Clark Ave., and its number lagged far out of sequence. It must have failed inspection miserably and been sent back for rework.

Another '53 Eldorado at Cole's Classics now is #37 (pictured left with Richard and Larry). Aaron got it as part of a package, and it presents a restoration challenge. (I thought *mine* was bad when I bought it!) No doubt, though, if Aaron decides to go for it, it will earn 100 points.

I like the way Aaron highlights the Engine Serial Numbers (a.k.a. VINs) on his restored frames. In 1953, Cadillac stamped each VIN twice on the right frame rail (pictured below right), once visibly next to the engine and

once further back, hidden under the body. The second stamp was for law enforcement or insurance purposes.



Above: Hidden VIN Location: Mid-Length and Right Rail

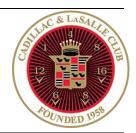




Above: Two VIN Locations on 1953 Chassis



While I was growing up, my dad had 1960 and '67 VW Beetles. So, in the beginning, I had no particular affinity for Cadillacs. However, I had always wanted an "old" car after seeing antique car displays on the local fairgrounds. I liked the big luxury cars of the mid-fifties, still on the road when I was a kid. Finally in 2011, I decided to purchase a 1956 Coupe Deville from a local gentleman. Soon I found the car had more problems than I originally thought but, undaunted, I left her with Doug, my ace mechanic, over the winter to perform the needed mechanical work.


I assisted Doug as much as possible by sending the clock and power antenna out for restoration and hand carrying the radio to Richmond for repairs. There the radio was delivered into the capable hands of a Russian named Yuri. (I noticed a label inside the radio that read "Made in the United States of America." How times have changed!)

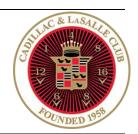
By late spring of 2012, my Cadillac was ready for a road trip! I had already decided to take her to a small diner in Belington, WV, about 40 miles away. I had driven by a few times in the past and thought it looked interesting. Despite a pretty bad head cold, I was determined to take this first opportunity, so I started her up and headed south on WV 92. This is a mostly straight and flat road, a relative rarity in West Virginia. Along the way are some farmlands, rolling hills, and a surviving "Chew Mail Pouch" ad painted on the side of a barn. In some areas the trees form enough of a canopy that one is inclined to turn on the headlights even on a sunny afternoon.

After a very enjoyable drive, I reached my destination without incident and went inside to place an order. After a short time, a gentleman walked in and asked, "Who's got this Cadillac out here?" I raised my hand and he said, "I probably built that car when I worked on the Fleetwood line from 1954 to 1969." Of course, this started a conversation with Charlie, a regular at the diner. I had worked for Ford Motor in Dearborn in the 1980s, and it turns out that we were familiar with some of the same southwest Detroit bakeries, restaurants, and bars.





Over time, I kept returning to the diner. Charlie was almost always there, and we struck up a friendship. Each time Charlie would come outside, look over the car and point out things that needed work or had been fixed or replaced incorrectly – things I may never have known without his expertise. What were the chances of finding such a resource as Charlie on my very first drive?

I diligently worked to fix everything he showed me by locating original parts and making correct repairs. After a few years of doing that, he looked over the car one day and said, "Well, now that doesn't look too bad". I was very pleased and proud, and felt that was likely high praise from him! Sadly, Charlie passed away this fall, just short of his 90th birthday. However, I know he lived a good long life and touched many other lives along the way. I'll always remember Charlie for his kindness, sense of humor, and knowledge of the auto industry in general and Cadillacs in particular.

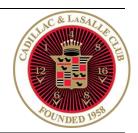



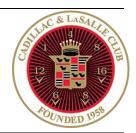
